Oregon tops UCLA statistically but loses lopsided game 41-10

PASADENA, Calif.—Faced with its biggest game in recent memory, the Oregon football team blinked under the bright lights of national scrutiny and the dense smog of southern California.

The Ducks committed seven turnovers. Oregon's normally sure-handed receivers dropped passes they usually catch. The special teams suffered through numerous breakdowns.

The UCLA Bruins graciously accepted the gift Oregon placed on their doorstep, and humbled the Ducks 41-10 at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena on Saturday.

Representatives from six bowl games were in attendance, as was ESPN and Sports Illustrated. Although they denied it, the Ducks appeared jittery under the glare of the publicity.

"There were too many mistakes. There are no excuses, we just didn't get it done, and we put the defense on the field too long," said Oregon quarterback Bill Musgrave, who threw

two interceptions, lost a fumble, and was sacked four times. For the first time this season, Musgrave did not throw a touchdown pass as he wound up completing 15 of 28 attempts for 195 yards.

"Bill's just a freshman, and it showed for the first time today," said Oregon offensive coordinator Bob Toledo.

With the loss, Oregon fell to 4-2, 2-1 in the Pacific-10 Conference. The Ducks are percentage points behind runner-up USC in third place in the Pac-10. USC surprised Washington in Seattle 37-23 to improve to 3-1 in conference play, 4-2 overall. The Ducks stay on the road next week, when they play Stanford (2-4, 1-2) in Palo Alto, Calif.

UCLA took Oregon out of its normal offense early. Outside linebacker Carnell Lake was too quick for Oregon's guards, and he poured through on Oregon's patented roll-out pass formation to sack Musgrave twice in the first quarter and later forced a fumble, which he recovered. "He was more of an athlete than we could handle," Toledo said.

UCLA coach Terry Donahue called Lake the best outside linebacker at UCLA in his 17 years there. "He did a tremendous job. His quickness was the single biggest factor in disrupting (Oregon's) offense," Donahue said.

UCLA moved into sole possession of the Pac-10 lead at
