Ducks win third-annual Oregon Challenge Cup

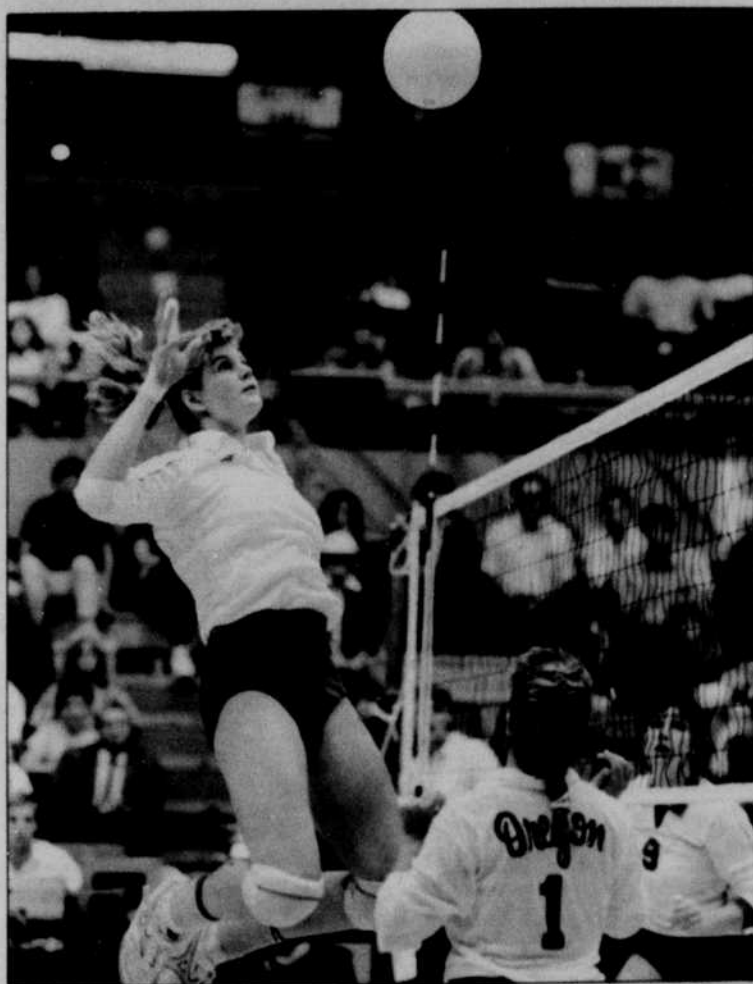

Three Ducks named to all-star team

The Oregon volleyball team defeated the Portland State Vikings in five games Saturday night to win the third annual Oregon Challenge Cup in Corvallis.

Teri Kramer led the 13th-ranked Ducks with 26 kills as they defeated the Vikings 15-12, 15-10, 5-15, 6-15, 15-10 to win their second straight Cup.

The Ducks placed Kramer, Tina Adolph and Laurie Krejcha on the tournament all-star team, and the Ducks boosted their record to 11-5 overall, 7-2 in the Pacific-10 Conference.

The Ducks defeated Oregon State in the first game of the tournament Friday 15-8, 8-15, 15-11, 15-11 in the first year OSU has hosted the Cup. The Ducks were led in hitting percentages by Eva Windlin (.364) and Lauri Krejcha (.348), while both teams recorded 11 service aces.

Portland State's record fell to 14-7 as the Ducks were led by Kramer and Krejcha's 20 blocks and Adolph's 57 assists.

The Ducks played Saturday's match without the services of

sophomore setter Stephanie Snyder, who injured her knee in the OSU contest when she ran into one of the net posts. Snyder should be available this weekend.

Oregon State defeated Portland 15-11, 15-8, 13-15, 15-10 in the consolation game Saturday evening, as the Beavers raised their record to 3-13 overall. Oregon State's record fell to 0-9 in the Pac-10 following Friday's loss to Oregon.

"Laurie Krejcha blocked very well for us tonight," Oregon coach Gerry Gregory said. "Teri Kramer and Melissa Terzian played steady offensively. I also thought Tina Adolph did a good job as the setter after playing a backup role the last couple of weeks," Gregory added.

Adolph was called into full-time duty when Snyder went down Friday.

Oregon sophomore hitter Michele Krebsbach, hampered by a shoulder injury, missed the OSU match and played only sparingly against PSU.

Oregon State's Julie Leamon led the Beavers Saturday night with a school-record 27 kills. OSU also set a school record with 14 blocked shots in the

game. Leamon finished the two games with 43 kills and 30 digs to win the tournament Most Valuable Player award.

Oregon continues Pac-10 play next weekend, when the team travels to Los Angeles for rematches with UCLA and USC. The Ducks swept both teams in McArthur Court earlier this season, including a four-game victory over the fourth-ranked Bruins.
