10 kilometer (6.2 mile) race, Oregon took a commanding lead.

Chad Bennion led Oregon, finishing seventh in a time of 30:49, and Brad Hudson followed in eighth at 30:54. Steve Richards (10th at 31:14), Buck Jones (11th at 31:22), Mark Dunbar (14th at 31:24), Seth Simonds (15th at 31:29) and Chuck Lewis (17th at 31:34) finished in Oregon's top seven.

The race ended with Mark Beeman of Nike-Boston winning in 30:01 and Cougar John Nabarilete finishing second in 30:07.

Bennion, who has been sick since the

Emerald City race, said "I hope to be in the top five at Pac-10," when asked about the Duck's next race at Stanford for the conference championship.

Dellinger said there were a couple of pleasant surprises, including the races of Jones, Dunbar, Richards, and Lewis. He also noted that the Ducks' gap time (the difference between the finishing time of a team's first and seventh men) was only 45 seconds. He said this reflects the depth of quality running on the team and a major reason for its victories.

Chuck Lewis, one of Dellinger's sur-

prises, said after the race, "I'm happy about the way I've come along from 16th man last year to 7th this year. I'm also excited about the possibility of running at Pac-10."

Lewis is from the San Francisco Bay area, and with the Pac-10 meet at Stanford, it would be a homecoming of sorts.

Dunbar, also a surprise Saturday, said "It's a long race for a 1,500 (meter) runner. It's probably the fastest 10K I've run. As a team we have to be pleased about the grouping being so tight."
