bably the most well-known Oregonian, history will remember him for the one who started the fight against Vietnam when it was unpopular, Porter said. Morse was one of two Senators opposing the Gulf of Tonkin Resolution.

"He needs to be remembered," Porter said. "He stood for integrity in politics and intelligence. We need more of those two things today."

Because of the meetings, most of the original furniture has been replaced. "It wouldn't withstand the traffic," Craft said.

Morse's study has been left intact, though, and a collection of political cartoons is in the basement. The cartoons are original prints, most dedicated to Morse by the authors. His study contains awards, books and photographs, and has not

been rearranged since his death.

The majority of the 26 acres has not been developed. Craft believes this has helped to maintain the quality of the park. Deer, raccoons and other wildlife frequent the park, she said.

"It's a little bit of wilderness in the city because it has been left alone," Craft said.

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
