Field News, the runner's Bible, and Bennion soon learned that if he wanted to take his running seriously, the place to be was Oregon.

Bennion's sophomore year was his first at Oregon. His cross country performance was hampered by sickness and injury, and his track season showed little promise, as his times failed to better those he ran the

previous year at Utah.

Bennion's junior year marked the point where his races began to settle into place. He ran fourth man on the cross country team that made the NCAA championships, and qualified for the NCAA Track and Field Championships in the 10,000 meters.

If one of Bennion's goals is to make up for the past, he is cer-

tainly wasting little time. Besides showing leadership on the course by finishing first, off the course he is described as a "dedicated team leader" by Dellinger.

The Oregon men's track and cross country coach can also sense the improvement in Bennion since his sophomore year at Oregon. "Chad has made a lot of progress, he has turned in-

to a pretty good runner. Even when he has an off day he runs well," Dellinger said.

In the future, Bennion hopes to run in the Olympic qualifying meet, and finish off his collegiate career at Oregon's Hayward Field, in the NCAA Track and Field Championships.

In discussing the current cross country season, Bennion said, "We have a team that is

qualified to be in the top five at the NCAAs. We should be competitive if everyone is healthy, that's the key."

Bennion seemed optimistic about his individual chance to compete well during the grueling weeks ahead. "I'm looking forward to a good year; I'm feeling the healthiest I have in a long time. Hopefully, I can surprise a few people," he said.

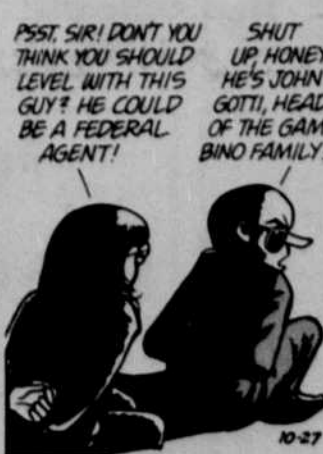
