information and help to make decisions on what (computers) they want to buy," she said.

The lab still offers consultation services for people who have problems with software packages that they have purchased, she said.

The new feature of the lab is the addition of three staff members to concentrate on support of the Microcomputer Purchase Plan that is offered to members of the University.

The plan is offered by three vendors, Apple Corporation, IBM and Zenith. These com-

panies offer University students, staff and faculty the opportunity to purchase some of their products at an average discount of 40 percent, Heerema said.

"We don't sell the computers. We provide non-biased support for those who want to decide what computers are available on the purchase plan," Heerema said.

The lab will also have several computers on display for people to test before deciding what they want, she said.

These include a Macintosh

Plus, a Macintosh SE, a Macintosh Two, the IBM PC line, and the new IBM Model 25s and 50s.

The lab also boasts the addition of five extra hours of service each day. It now operates from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. as compared to the former hours that were from 1:30 p.m. to 5 p.m. each day.

The consulting office is open from 9 a.m. to noon, and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. and will possibly include representatives from software companies present.

"If a staff member can't help you with something, they will refer you to someone who can," Heerema added. "We have employees who can answer almost every question about software packages."

Linda Fernandes is a student programmer with the Computing Center. A graduate student of computer information sciences, Fernandes was also a consultant at the old Micro Support Lab last year.

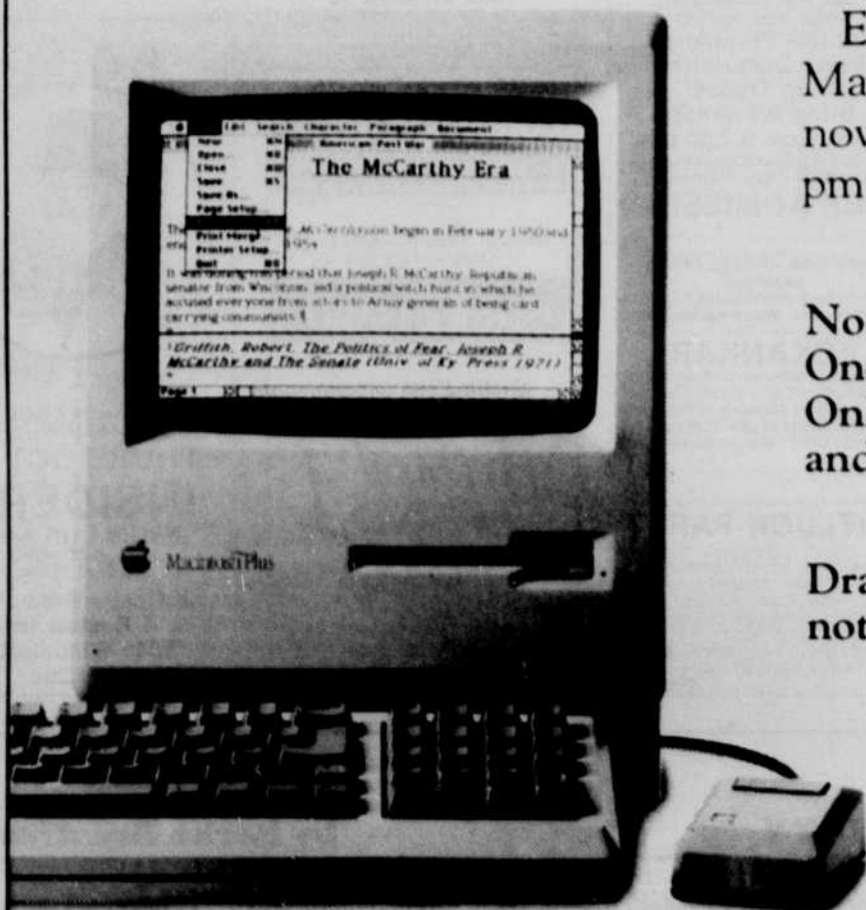
Fernandes believes that the new lab, with the increased space and number of employees, will be able to offer more in depth service than before.

The construction will cost \$78,100. Dan Williams, vice president for administration, said the funding is from energy savings money set aside almost two years ago for this purpose.
