a student cartoonist for the Oregon Daily Emerald, challenged Donald to a popularity contest in the spring of 1978. A campus-wide student vote in conjunction with the annual student elections gave Donald his win as mascot three to one.

In the late 1960s, a male cheerleader wearing a green, papiermache duck head frequently appeared at ballgames. In the early 1970s, then head football coach Dick Enright organized a group known as the Daisy Ducks, and by the mid-1970s a female cheerleader representing University women athletes appeared on the scene as Donna Duck.

Later, in 1981, through a stroke of ingenuity, came Super Duck. This duck, dressed like Superman, made his first and last appearance that same year. Super Duck lacked popularity and thus was grounded.

When Donald Duck celebrated his 50th birthday in June of 1984, Walt Disney Production Inc. brought its nationwide tour to Eugene. The Executive Director of the Alumni Association presented Donald with an academic cap and gown and named him an honorary University alumnus.

Through the years our mascot has metamorphasized into one of the state's most popular mascots — the duck officially is ours now, and people seem to like him.



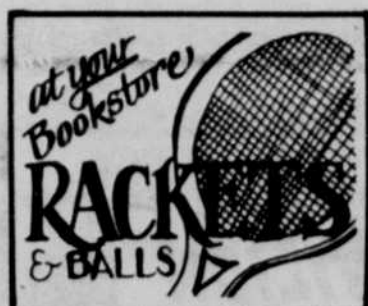
