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Police continue to probe racial incident near PLC

Eugene police continued their investigation Wednesday into a racial incident that occurred near PLC on Tuesday.

University student Victor Adonri was approached by two white males as he parked his car near Kincaid Street and 14th Avenue Tuesday morning. As Adonri walked to class, one of the suspects shouted, "go home nigger." When Adonri returned from class an hour-and-a-half later, he discovered a fir tree branch had been thrown across the top of his car and that his rear license plate had been bent upwards.

The suspects were described by Adonri as being in their early 20s and standing 5 feet 9 inches to 5 feet 11 inches tall. The suspect shouting the racial slurs was wearing a brown sweater and black pants and had light brown hair.

According to Sgt. Dick Hansen, police have checked out a license plate number of

a car apparently belonging to the suspects but have been hampered in their investigation because the number furnished is apparently missing one digit.

The car was described as a older-model, silver Ford Ranchero with California license plates.

"We're kind of stuck in the mud until we find the car the crooks were driving," Hansen said.

Following the Tuesday morning incident, Adonri testified against a Springfield businessman who pointed a cap gun at him last June when he entered the man's store.

Donald Ray Tackett was convicted by a Springfield Municipal Court jury of disorderly conduct Tuesday evening.

"Other than very suspicious circumstances," a connection has not been made yet between the Tuesday morning incident and the trial, Hansen said.
