Women runners seize Pac-10 title, oust UCLA with top three finishers

The Ducks swept the top three places and dominated the women's Pacific-10 Conference cross country championships Monday at Palo Alto, Calif.

Senior Annette Hand, sophomore Liz Wilson and junior Penny Graves prevailed during the race as the Ducks finished far ahead of second-place UCLA to successfully defend their Pac-10 crown.

Four of the top six runners were Ducks, with Hand (16:44), Wilson (16:46) and Graves (16:54) taking the top three spots. Senior Lisa Johnson (17:13) placed sixth and sophomore Karen Rayle (17:55) finished 17th.

Oregon finished the race with 29 points, outscoring UCLA by a margin of more than two-to-one. UCLA bettered last year's 78 points with a score of 64. Washington State had 91, and Arizona State and host Stanford tied for fourth with 123.

Cal had a score of 142 for sixth place, followed by seventh-place Washington's 159, and eighth-place Arizona's 177. Oregon State rounded out the field with a score of 254 for ninth and last place. USC does not field a women's cross-country team.

Graves, who won last year's

Pac-10 conference meet, was just a couple of seconds behind her winning time, but it was only good enough for third place this year, with Hand and Wilson running so well.

Hand won despite the fact it was her first season of cross country running. This was also Wilson's first Pac-10 meet, yet she finished just two seconds

behind Hand.

Judging by the quality of this year's sophomores, the Pac-10 will probably continue to have problems with Oregon in the future. The progress of sophomore runners such as Wilson, Rayle, and Tyson will be watched closely by the Ducks' Pac-10 competitors.

The conference meet was the

last tune-up before the Ducks compete in the Region VII qualifying race on Nov. 14 in Fresno, Calif. The winner of the Region VIII meet gets an automatic NCAA berth and one more Region VIII team may be selected at large for the national meet.

The NCAA championships will be held Nov. 23 in Charlottesville, Va.

Men place second once again, Arizona takes conference title

For the third straight year and for the fourth year in the past five, the Oregon men's cross country team has finished second in the Pacific-10 Conference Championship. The Ducks fell to the Arizona Wildcats Monday at the meet run on the Stanford Golf Course in Palo Alto, Calif.

Arizona finished the 10,000-meter race with five runners in the top 12 to capture the team title with 32 points. The Ducks were runners-up with 71 points and Washington State finished third with 94 points. Matt Giusto of Arizona captured the individual crown by completing the course in a time of 30:33.

Jacinto Navarrete of WSU took second in 30:39 and Oregon's Chad Bennion finished third in 30:43. Bennion's goal was to be in the top five.

Practically no one could have stopped the charged-up 11th-ranked Wildcats on route to their fourth Pac-10 championship in five years.

Ninth-ranked Oregon will try to forget the race as they will see Arizona again Nov. 14 at the NCAA Region VIII in Fresno, Calif., and possibly at the NCAA National Championships in Charlottesville, Va., on Nov. 23.

Oregon Coach Bill Dellinger called Oregon's race "not spectacular" as they failed to penetrate Arizona's depth of runners. However, Dellinger said, "next week is a whole new

race," referring to the District VIII run in Fresno.

The Ducks can look to their fourth, fifth and sixth men (Marc Dunbar in 21st, Seth Simonds in 23rd, and Peter Fonseca in 24th) all running within two seconds of each other to make a huge difference in future meets if, as a group, they can move closer to the front.

Dellinger was pleased that redshirt-freshman Fonseca was able to run, after being out with an injured Achilles tendon and bruised heel. Fonseca is expected to be closer to top shape at the District VIII meet. Dellinger was also happy with Bennion in third and Carleton Jones in eighth as they made large im-

provements over last year's race.

Following Bennion in fourth place was James Maxwell of Arizona, 30:52. Rounding out the top ten individuals were Fredson Mayiek of Southern California, fifth in 31:02; Marc Davis of Arizona, sixth in 31:08; and Marcello Cascabelo of Washington State in 31:08.

Also, Oregon's Jones was eighth in 31:12, Simon Gutierrez of Arizona placed ninth in 31:13, and Jason Flamm of California clocked at 31:14.

Other Oregon finishers include Brad Hudson, 16th in 31:35; Dunbar, 21st in 31:44; Simonds, 23rd in 31:45; Fonseca, 24th at 31:46; and Steve Richards, 31st at 31:58.



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
