

vote to be carried to the State Board's meeting on Nov. 13.

One resolution urged the State Board to reconsider the executive committee's decision and extend Olum's retirement date to June 30, 1992. The second resolution deplored the State Board's lack of consultation with University faculty "and other constituencies."

Both motions passed unanimously.

Several members of the University faculty have requested that the State Board change the decision of the executive committee, arguing the committee proceeded with insufficient knowledge and understanding of the current state and dynamics of the University.

According to Gilkey, the executive committee's decision was of "extremely inopportune timing." The University presently is seeking a new academic vice president and provost, and also is involved in the early stages of a major capital gifts campaign. Members of the Assembly addressed these concerns while the motions were debated.

Theodore Palmer, mathematics professor and vice-chair of the provost search, believes "we can bring a very good provost to lead the University." Palmer cited a need for an orderly transition with the president and the provost, stating, "No one is going to come to this campus to be provost for one year, particularly under the (existing) conditions."

Several assembly members disagreed with the lack of faculty, staff and administrative consultation regarding the executive committee's decision, citing other examples in which the University has had no direct communication with the State Board.

In response to the lack of consultation by the State Board, Peter von Hippel, chemistry professor and member of the Institute of Molecular Biology,

presented a final motion to the assembly that a group be called together to address the State Board's meeting on Nov. 13.

Moreover, this motion requested that a representative of the faculty and another of the student body be granted time at the State Board's Nov. 13 meeting to address concerns they have regarding Olum's retirement date.

This motion also passed unanimously.

"There have been a whole bunch of areas where people external to the University have made decisions without consultation," Gilkey said, adding, "The Board hasn't asked how we feel about it — we're asking for some input into the decision


making."

Several students and faculty members praised Olum's policies and efforts as University President, crediting Olum as someone with an interest in both the students and faculty. Appreciation and support for Olum was shown in a standing ovation by the assembly before Olum called the meeting to order. In addition, handful of Olum supporters displayed a large red and white banner declaring "Keep Paul Olum."

"Paul has been, is, and would continue to be a superb president. He is the only president of a university that commends the faculty and staff the way he does, and I've been at a number of universities," Gilkey said.

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
