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more accessible to campus, and to create an atmosphere for the area," said Juliana Rebagliati, project coordinator for the workshop.

David Rowe, University Planner, noted that the proposal is only being considered, and has not yet been accepted.

Discussion and alternative proposals from the meeting will be considered by the workshop and presented at a meeting on Nov. 21.

Included in the survey process was a 20 percent sampling of area residents as to their concerns about the project. Most residents showed an interest in the growth of the business area, but would rather see alternatives to the proposal.

Jeff Perlman, graduate student in the School of Architecture and a resident of East Campus Housing, voiced several concerns with the proposed parking lot.

"The sight plan doesn't look at anything but the parking lot. They're not looking at alternatives," Perlman said.

The East Campus Housing residents also are concerned with the lack of representation they had in developing the study.

"I am not happy with the representation in the

neighborhood," Perlman said, adding, "We need time to study this matter, and time to meet with various groups about this."

However, Rowe commended the workshop for circulating information about the proposal to East Campus Housing residents.

"I know that they're aware of it, but I don't know if they've been in on the discussions," he said.

It was determined in the plan that access to the parking lot directly from Agate Street would inhibit smooth traffic flow in the vicinity of the 19th and Agate intersection.

For this reason, the workshop suggested that the alley between 19th and 17th Avenues should be paved and made one-way heading north, with one or two access drives to the parking area.

Perlman feels that such access

East Campus Housing residents voiced concern for this proposal in that it would force their children to cross 19th Avenue in order to use the play structures.

Dan Williams, University vice president for administration, previously stated that the University is sensitive to the concerns of the business area at issue and the relationship this area has to the University.

There are between 350 and 400 student-athletes.

The new policy says the volunteer accepts the protocol and the sanction system of the University's drug testing policy and no jeopardy or sanction will be imposed on those not accepting it. The new policy also says mandatory testing may still occur for reasonable suspicion, and once volunteered the student-athlete can only withdraw prior to any positive test.

Once tested positive, the student-athlete cannot withdraw their consent for retesting without suffering consequences described in the

policy, which may include dismissal from the team and loss of scholarship.

With the new policy, the student-athlete agrees to be tested for all the substances stated in the National Collegiate Athletic Association banned-drug list. There are more than 80 banned substances listed.

Voelz stressed that punishments are clearly defined because the Athletic Department wants the student-athletes to know exactly how the policy will be enforced. She added that coaches are not allowed to influence the players and said she hoped peer pressure would set the example.

"Some of the players said they wanted to set an example, and didn't like the bad rap the

press puts on athletes because some use drugs," Voelz said.

But she also said that she did not know how many will come forward.

"I have no idea who will come forward. I don't expect everybody because some that believe in it think it's an inconvenience and some don't believe in it at all," Voelz said.

While drug testing is now voluntary at the University, the NCAA may enforce mandatory drug testing prior to post-season play in volleyball and cross country, sports in which the University is nationally-ranked and likely to see NCAA tournament action. The NCAA conducted random drug testing at all football bowl games last year, and will do the same this year.

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
