when Nelson came in.

But Nelson's third pass was tipped by Sun Devil defensive end Rick Zumwalt, who intercepted the ball and rambled all the way to the Duck 38 before Oregon tailback Derek Loville caught him from behind.

The Ducks stiffened again, forcing ASU to settle for Zendejas' third field goal with 1:20 left in the half.

Arizona State quarterback Dan Ford waited until the third quarter, when the Oregon pass rush faltered noticeably, to real-

ly find his range. He and wide receiver Aaron Cox made quick work of Oregon's young secondary.

The Ducks' Chris Oldham, a sophomore, was pressed into a lot of playing time at cornerback. Put into one-on-one coverage by ASU play-action, he was helpless as Cox hauled in six catches for 160 yards, including a back-breaking 47-yard touchdown in the third period.

That strike came one play after the Ducks had turned the ball over on downs with a failed pass off a fake punt. It gave ASU

a 23-6 lead and took the starch out of the Duck defense.

Nelson (13 of 20 for 169 yards, one touchdown and one interception) had combined with tight end Joe Meerten on a 41-yard pass play to give the Ducks their first touchdown and even after Kirk Dennis missed the extra point, it was 9-6 with 7:36 to go in the third quarter.

But ASU answered with a touchdown march of their own. helped by two official's calls that had Brooks - who received two unsportsmanlike conduct penalties in the first half - livid

on the sidelines.

After Oregon stopped ASU at the Oregon 22-yard line. Zendejas missed a 39-yard field goal attempt. But linebacker Tom Talbot was called for using a teammate to gain leverage in the block attempt, giving ASU a first down at the Oregon 11. Two plays later Oldham was flagged for pass interference. and Williams bulled over from a yard out.


The Ducks, behind Loville, came back one more time after Cox' score. The sophomore

tailback, who led Oregon with 69 yards on 18 carries, rushed for 32 yards on the drive, including the last 16 for a touchdown, to make the score 23-13 less than one minute into the fourth quarter.

This time when called upon. the Oregon defense had nothing left to give.

The Sun Devils got two long runs behind All-Pac-10 right tackle Todd Kalis for touchdowns, 23 and 24 yards by backup tailbacks Vic Cahoon and David Winsley, respectively, to provide the final margin.
