the student support for Paul Olum. I can't tell the students what to do, but it would probably be best if they didn't strike — the overriding concern is that students get educated," von Hippel said.

He added the symbolic aspects of a class strike would be important, however, he would like to see the state board "be convinced by reason rather than sheer numbers."

Steve Nelson, former ASUO president and student representative who will address the state board, said he was all for the

strike and hopes it will send a strong signal to the board.

"I think the rally on Thursday and the strike and the sit-in at the meeting should send a strong message that we're very concerned about the loss of Dr. Olum," Nelson said.

Nelson believes the University faces a critical period over the next five years. "With all the projects considered and the attitude of the faculty, I think that this (state board retiring Olum) will be the worst possible decision," Nelson said.

Nelson realizes Olum, Hill

and von Hippel oppose the proposed student strike, but said that was to be expected.

"Their job is to keep things going. A lot of us discussed it (the strike) and we think it's the best way for us to show our disapproval of the decision — it's certainly the mildest thing that can be done by somebody who gets upset about such ... an all-encompassing decision that we had no say in," Nelson added.

Doug Card, a sociology instructor, finds major fault with the idea of Friday's student strike.

"It's the most counter-productive symbol I can imagine," Card said.

Moreover, Card believes students will be striking against the wrong people.

"It's going to give these off-campus bureaucrats the really misleading impression, which is that our students are a little flaky and irresponsible and unacademic," Card said.

absence at the meeting Wednesday, the University Senate postponed the vote until its next meeting.

The senate approved Keith Richard's motion to amend current parking rules, which would establish a ceiling on what is considered reserve parking and increase the number of general parking spaces in use.

Due to the proliferation of reserve parking spaces, the parking situation at the University has gotten more and more intolerable, said Richard, the University archivist.

"I know of people who work in Oregon Hall who have to arrive to work around 7 a.m. just to get parking spaces, but they don't go on payroll until 8 a.m. I don't think this is fair to these people," Richard said.

The University Senate also approved Robert Mazo's motion asking any changes the administration wishes to make in the reduced tenure program be submitted in writing to faculty for approval. Currently, the program exists at the will of the administration, according to Mazo, a chemistry professor.

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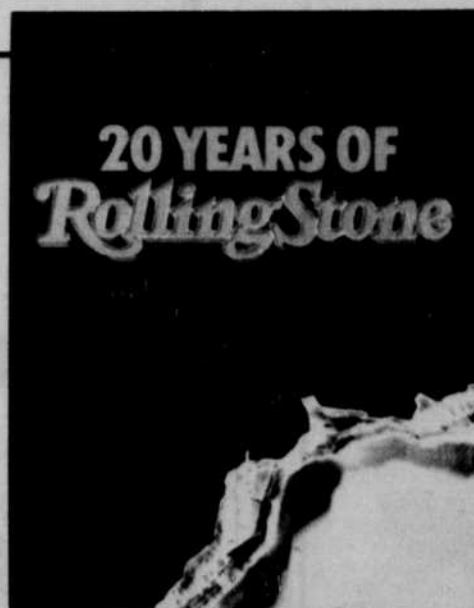
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
