Women harriers roll...

The Oregon women's cross-country team dominated the National Collegiate Athletic Association Region VIII cross country meet Saturday in Fresno, CA. Once again, Annette Hand, Liz Wilson, and Penny Graves swept the top three spots, to solidify the Ducks' ranking at the top of the NCAA.

Hand (16:19.0), Wilson (16:25.1), and Graves (16:35.3) finished in the exact order that they did in the Pacific-10 Conference championship, as the Ducks finished with 29 points to 68 for second place UC-Irvine.

Sixth-place Lisa Johnson (16:55.2) and 17th-place Karen Rayle (17:30.1) also duplicated their efforts in the Pac-10 meet, finishing in exactly the same places in a much broader Region VIII field.

California's Kirsten O'Hara was fourth, finishing just 3.2 seconds behind Graves in 16:38.5. Graves and O'Hara duelled over the last mile with Graves finishing with a sprint to take third.

Deanna Scheidler (17:36.0) finished the race in the 20th spot, followed by Libby Tyson (17:53.8) in 36th place out of a field of more than 50 runners.

Men roll over at Region VIII meet

It all ended suddenly. The hopes of a team of seven young runners and a veteran coach were extinguished. They were shocked.

Everyone expected Oregon's 12th-ranked men harriers to breeze into the NCAA Cross Country Championship next Monday in Charlottesville, W. Va. Instead only Chad Bennion, the experienced pilot of the team will visit the east coast.

The men's cross country team placed fourth at the NCAA Region VIII meet run at Woodward Park in Fresno, Calif., with 128 points. Arizona with 72 points, Washington, with 116 points, and Cal-Irvine with 119 points placed first, second and third respectively, and will represent the West at

Charlottesville.

The Duck's Bennion took third individually with a time of 30:10.4 behind Arizona's Matt Giusto and Washington's Jacinto Navarrete.

"Chad ran well, he has run real consistent throughout the entire season, and he topped it off by qualifying for the NCAA's," said Oregon coach Bill Dellinger.

Dellinger, however, was not so pleased with the performances of everyone else, and said Arizona was not unbeatable. "Arizona ran well but they didn't run away with it. Washington had some really good performances and Cal-Irvine was right there. It was all very close in the top four (teams) but we didn't perform."

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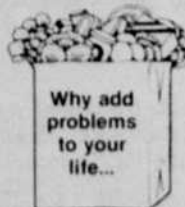
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
