Newman has five reasons to beat OSU

There are many who might say the 91st renewal of the Civil War between Oregon (5-5, 3-4 in the Pacific-10 Conference) and Oregon State (2-8, 0-7) doesn't mean anything. Senior strong safety Anthony Newman is not one of them.

Newman, recently named the fifth-best strong safety in the nation by the Sporting News, has several incentives to motivate him for the Civil War, and Oregon's 11-year winning streak over OSU is at the top of the list.

"I want to go out saying I never lost to Oregon State. That means a lot to me," Newman said during an interview Thursday. "If we can end up 6-5 the season will be great," he said.

The Ducks have not lost to the Beavers since 1974. They lead the series with OSU by a 43-37-10 margin. Newman is a big reason for that advantage.

The 6-foot-1, 206-pound product of Beaverton High School will play in his last collegiate game on Saturday, and he wants it to be a memorable one.

As one of only two fourth-year seniors on the team (along with nose tackle Rollin Putzier), Newman sees the game as an opportunity to legitimize the Oregon football program, to post the second winning season of his career, and thinks it would make a nice birthday present. He turns 22 on Saturday.

"That would make for a nice celebration," he conceded.

The number 22 has other significance, as well. Since Newman first put on the pads

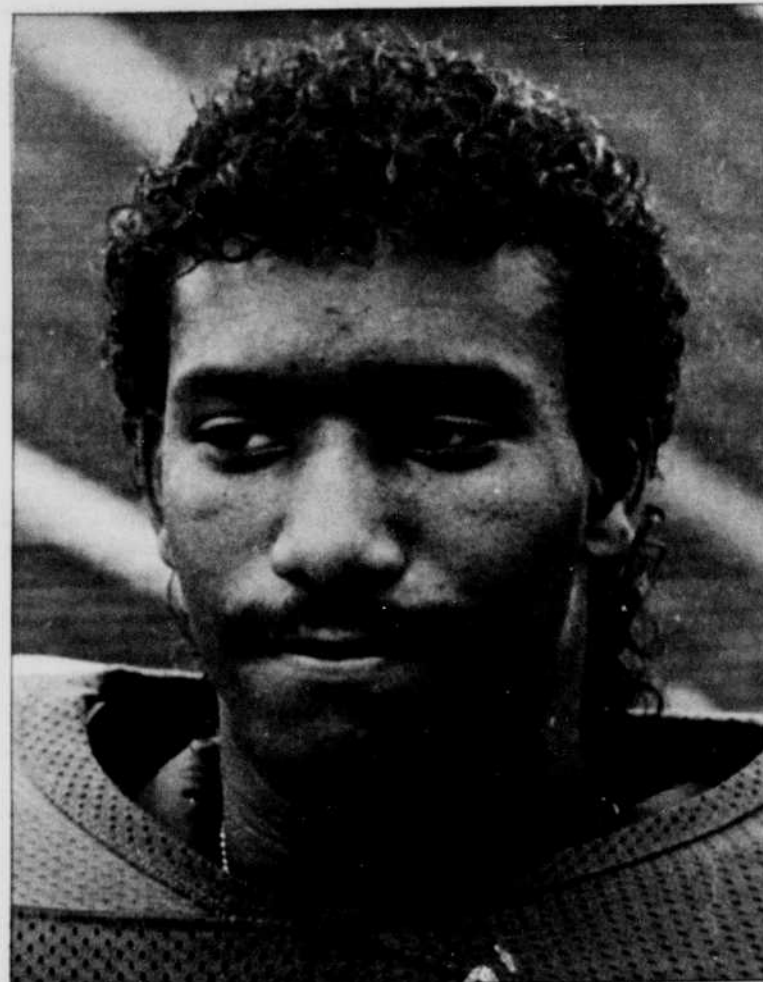

for coach Rich Brooks as a true freshman, the Ducks have posted a 21-22 record.

A victory over OSU would guarantee a .500 record during his career, and Oregon has not finished with a non-losing record for that long a span in 25 years.

"It might not sound like

much to some people, but it is important. It means we've been on top of things. We've lost a few tough games, but we've been competitive," he said.

The end of college will not signal the end of Newman's football career, not the way it will for most of those suiting up. Newman's propensity for the big play and his physical tools are too good for that. The National Football League beckons, and Newman has also been drafted by pro baseball teams each of the last four years.

Don't expect Newman to pull a page from the Bo Jackson file and trade his football cleats for baseball spikes. "Football is my life. Baseball is too slow," he said.

NFL scouts have made a habit of gathering around Oregon's defensive back drills, and Newman is the focus of their attention.
