Arizona win leaves Duck spikers with split

Following the Oregon volleyball team's three-game win over 20th-ranked Arizona State on Friday, Ducks head coach Gerry Gregory said, "Hopefully this isn't just a one-match phenomenon," when asked if his team had returned to its early season form.

The Ducks' 15-13, 15-11, 15-10 victory over the Sun Devils (15-12 overall, 9-9 in the Pacific-10 Conference) was

followed by what Gregory hopes was a one-match "fluke" loss to Arizona on Saturday, 18-16, 15-10, 19-17, in front of 1,255 fans at McArthur Court.

The weekend split concluded the Duck's regular season, and leaves Oregon with a 17-10 record, 11-7 in the Pac-10.

The Ducks currently are in a two-way tie for fourth place in the Pac-10, but could move into a three-way tie for third if UCLA defeats USC in the conference finale Tuesday night.

Oregon looked and played in-

spired against the Sun Devils. After ASU jumped out to a 7-1 advantage in game one, the Ducks turned up the heat, reeled off five straight points, and eventually took a 14-13 lead on a Lauri Krejcha block.

The Sun Devils, facing elimination, put up a 4-0 lead to begin game three. Gregory called a time-out, and Oregon promptly scored the next five

points to take the lead. Stephanie Drier put away a kill to give the Ducks a 13-7 lead, and Oregon held on for the match win.

The Ducks' Teri Kramer had only four kills in the first and second games, but saved the best for game three.

"In between the second and third games, Gerry talked to me and really pumped me up," Kramer said.

The All-American candidate hammered eight kills in the third game to finish with 12.

On Saturday against Arizona (18-11, 9-9), the Ducks were looking for a victory which would have extended their win streak to five, and likely would have given them sole possession of third place.

"It's frustrating," Gregory said after the match. "Arizona did a nice job, and the breaks just didn't go our way. I thought we played well, but I felt we weren't fighting hard enough. We had a lot of missed opportunities."

With her 18 kills against the Wildcats, Kramer upped her career kills mark to 1,740, good for the number two spot on the all-time Oregon list.

Oregon now will await word from the National Collegiate Athletic Association on a possible spot in the post-season tournament, which begins Dec. 3. The NCAA tournament teams will be announced Nov. 28, with 32 schools receiving automatic or at-large bids.

Texas, North Carolina State and Wisconsin are among the schools expected to make a run at the Webfoots. Oregon handily beat Wisconsin on Oct 10.

Senior Chad Bennion, third in the Pac-10 and Region VIII, is the only member of Oregon's men's team competing. Bennion finished 66th in last year's NCAA meet.
