# Ducks trounce Beavers

Oregon kept in-state bragging rights and continued its Civil War dominance with a 44-0 lashing over Oregon State in front of 43,157 fans in Autzen Stadium Saturday afternoon.

The Ducks bashed the Beavers for the 12th time in the last 13 years, the only blemish during that time span being a 0-0 forgettable tie in 1983. The win also kept Oregon coach Rich Brooks' Civil War record perfect, as he has never lost an intrastate matchup as a player or coach.

"I just happen to be where the best players are. There isn't any mysticism to it; we just have the best players and I'm fortunate to be on the team with the most talent," Brooks said after the game.

Besides the winning streak, a number of other records were set Saturday. For the first time in more than 20 years a four-year class escaped without a losing record.

"I'm real proud of our seniors. They can say they

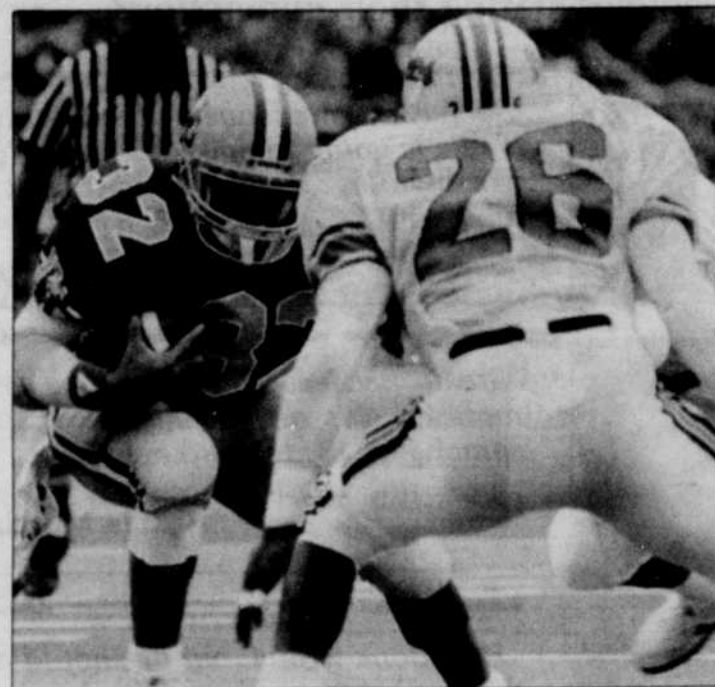

never lost to Oregon State and went through four years with a .500 record, and that hasn't happened for 25 years. Hopefully, this will spr-

ingboard us into a eight- or nine-win season in the future," Brooks said.

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## Oregon shut out of bowl-game selections

The streak continued, but the day after brought disappointment.

Oregon drilled intrastate rival Oregon State 44-0 in

Autzen Stadium Saturday yet still came up empty in its bid for a bowl game.

The Ducks, 6-5, were considered among five teams to play Oklahoma State in the John Hancock Sun Bowl. But early Sunday morning the Christmas Day wish became a stocking filled with coal as the Sun Bowl committee selected West Virginia — another 6-5 team — to play in the Dec. 25 bowl.

"Obviously, I'm disappointed but I have nothing to do with it (the selection). If West Virginia had a better record I wouldn't feel so bad. But if a 6-5 team deserves to go to a bowl we do," Coach Rich Brooks said Sunday afternoon.

Brooks also said the decision didn't come as a shock and alluded that reputation and money may have been the reasons for the snub.

"I'm not surprised," Brooks said. "West Virginia has been to a few bowls the last five or six years and they have taken people and bought a lot of tickets."

Oregon defensive standout Anthony Newman also expressed displeasure with the selection.

"They seemed to find another way to keep us out again," the senior captain said.

Although the Ducks won't continue, Newman and senior noseguard Rollin Putzier will be spending the holiday season out of state. Newman will spend the new year in Japan and Hawaii competing in the Japan and Hula Bowls, while Putzier will be in Alabama during Christmas competing in the Senior Bowl and Blue-Gray game.

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
