

## Lady Ducks rack up decisive first victory

The Oregon women's basketball team took out its frustrations against Gonzaga Friday night in a 70-55 drubbing, opening their 1987-88 season

1-0. After the Australian national team dumped the Ducks in an exhibition contest last Tuesday, the Ducks weren't about to let Gonzaga steal another victory in McArthur Court. "We all felt we had something to prove, and we

weren't pleased with our game against the Australians. The win proved we have the makings of a good team. This was a good place to start," Oregon coach Elwin Heiny said.

The Ducks thoroughly outplayed the undersized Bulldogs, who dropped to 0-1, and outrebounded Gonzaga 47-39. The Ducks also never let Gonzaga in the game, as Jacque Semeniuk scored the first two points and Oregon never looked back.

Oregon streaked to leads of 9-4 and 21-11 early in the first half as Semeniuk dished off three of her game high six assists. Semeniuk led the Ducks in scoring with 18 points.

"Jacque played a very good game, and she did a lot of things that don't appear in the stats. She showed that she could play an outstanding game," Heiny said.

Gonzaga pulled within six at the half, 33-27, but Oregon went on a tear to open the second half, outscoring Gonzaga 20-11 and pushing their lead to 53-38.

After the Duck streak, the Bulldogs tried to make it interesting by pulling within eight, 55-47, with 8:58 left in the game. But Oregon went on another tirade, scoring 11 unanswered points and blitzing ahead 66-47 — the largest lead of the game.

Along with Semeniuk's 18 points, center Stefanie Kasperki scored 17 points in 22 foul-plagued minutes. Gonzaga's Tammy Tibbles led all scorers with 19 points.

The Ducks now travel to Missoula, Mont., for this

weekends Domino's Pizza Lady Grizzlies Classic Tournament, which traditionally has been a trap for visiting opponents.

While the tournament will be tough, Heiny sees it as a great challenge.

"The odds are against us to win in Missoula, but we like to upset the odds."

After the Ducks weekend trip, Oregon will go on a cross country tour, playing 10 of their next 11 games on the road.

The only home stand during that stretch is Dec. 21 date against Utah.

### Netters Stanford bound

The Oregon volleyball team will travel to Stanford for a first-round National Collegiate Athletic Association tournament match with the fourth-ranked Cardinal Thursday at 7:30 p.m., the NCAA announced on Sunday.

Stanford won the Pacific-10 championship with a 17-1 league mark. The Cardinal is the top seed in the Western Region. Oregon wound up tied for fourth in the Pac-10 (11-7), and is the region's eighth seed. Stanford swept the Ducks in two regular season matches without dropping a game.

The at-large selection marks the second consecutive year, and third in the last four, that Oregon has gone to the NCAA tournament. Stanford beat the Ducks in four games in the first round last year.
