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Students establish council in order to voice concern

University East Campus Housing system students began the formation of a tenants council Wednesday to promote residents' interests with the University and its housing department.

The group hopes to deal with problems ranging from campus expansion to the conversion of the Condon School playground into a parking lot.

At the meeting, Teresa Bishow of the Eugene City Planning Department told the group that the proposed conversion of the Condon playground was just a design and no final decision was made. She said students would have a chance to voice opinions about the conversion at Saturday's community meeting at the Condon

School auditorium. The meeting begins a 10 a.m.

Also, University Associate Housing Director Don Moon Lee said there aren't any plans to expand the University into the East Campus neighborhood.

"Right now there is not a plan for any academic expansion that area," he said.

Although it is operating informally, Lee said the group can advise the housing department on East Campus issues until it becomes officially recognized by the University.

The East Campus system is a student-family housing neighborhood, consisting of 120 homes ranging from studio units to six-bedroom houses in a four-block area southeast of campus.
