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IFC enters membership crisis

As the Incidental Fee Committee heads into the budgeting process — its busiest time of the year — one member resigned Friday and another faces a recall vote at the next meeting.

The Friday morning IFC meeting was dominated by discussion of removing member Laurie Clark from the committee for nonperformance of duties. Clark, who was not at the meeting, only has been to two of the nine meetings this term. The committee decided to vote for her removal at the next meeting, Jan. 11.

At the end of the meeting, committee member Sandra Thompson resigned, saying she does not have the time to do the job properly.

In a statement, during which she often had to stop and fight back tears, Thompson told the

committee, "I feel that commitments I have elsewhere on campus are not excuse enough to not fulfill the duties I have here to the ability I think this job requires. I feel right now like I'm hanging by my fingernails, and next term does not look better."

"I do not want to have to not show up at meetings. It's hard for me because I've never dropped out of anything with this level of commitment. But at the same time, I feel like it needs to be done."

"It was a tough decision," said Thompson, a graduate student in marketing. She said she hoped Clark would follow her example and resign. Clark has said she has missed IFC meetings because of illness and academic work at the law school.

"Regardless of whether one's a law student, a graduate student or an undergraduate, that is not reason enough to not

fulfill the duties of the job," Thompson said. "When you take on the job, you take on the entirety of the job, regardless of whether papers are due. Whatever other commitments there are, there should not be special allowances because somebody is busy."

In a memo to committee members, Clark said that she could not be at the Friday meeting because of dead week at the law school. Because she had informed the committee she would not be there, the committee decided to postpone the vote of removal until Jan. 11, regardless of whether Clark attends.

Committee member Steve Hoyt said he had "serious concerns" about voting without Clark at the meeting. "I don't feel comfortable about voting on someone without them being here," he said.

IFC Chairman Bob Baldwin said he was concerned about postponing the vote, which would further postpone getting an active member on the committee.

"The situation has finally gotten out of hand," Baldwin said. "Action today would not have a seventh member on this committee until mid to late January at best."

After a position is advertised in the Oregon Daily Emerald, ASUO President Kasey Brooks will then recommend a replacement to the Student Senate, which then takes a confirmation vote. The ASUO will start advertising for the job on Jan. 6, the first day of winter term classes. Brooks said the position — or positions, if the IFC votes to remove Clark in January — should be filled by mid-January.

"It's finally hit the point where we need to ask what is in the best interest of the student body, what is in the best interest of the committee, and if Clark is too busy to be on the committee, she should go pursue her academic career," Baldwin said. "What has Clark done this term? The answer is nothing."

Baldwin formally informed Clark of the committee's grievances against her in a Nov. 25 memo. She responded with a three-page single-spaced memo dated Nov. 30 defending her absences and saying that 40 percent of the groups for which she helps prepare budgets have already finished that process. She said Baldwin was being "unreasonable in pursuing this issue."

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
