Purdue puts one over on Ducks

The Purdue Boilermakers played flawless basketball Saturday night against a younger and inexperienced Oregon team, rolling over the Ducks 88-62 in non-conference men's basketball action.

The game, played in front of 14,123 at sold-out Mackey Arena in West Lafayette, Ind., was the first road contest of the season for Oregon, now 2-1.

Oregon was again without Anthony Taylor, as the senior guard continues to recover from

a broken-toe injury suffered last week.

The game had all the signs of a blowout even before the opening tip.

The 11th-ranked Boilermakers were looking to take advantage of Taylor's absence and the Ducks' inexperience, as four junior college transfers and three freshman got their first taste of playing a top-20 major college team on the road.

Some responded well, and some didn't.

Turnovers plagued the Ducks all night. Oregon turned the ball over on three of their first four possessions, had 18 at halftime, and finished the game with 23.

Frank Johnson, starting his second-straight game for the injured Taylor, led all scorers with a career-high 20 points. On the down side, the junior point guard committed seven turnovers.

Oregon played tentative in the first half, as the Ducks continued to miss easy shots inside.

Everette Stephens, Purdue's senior point guard, scored nine of his team's first 11 points as the Boilermakers jumped out to a quick 11-2 lead.

The 6-foot-2 spark plug hit two three-point shots in the half, his second giving Purdue a 34-14 lead. Oregon was already in the coffin waiting for the final nail.

Ryan Berning's three-pointer widened the margin to 43-16, and whatever chance Oregon might have had disappeared when Keith Balderston, the Ducks' starting forward, went down with a sprained ankle with 5:50 remaining in the first half.

Balderston left with four points and did not return.

Richard Lucas, a 6-7 freshman from Anaheim, Calif., replaced Balderston in the second half for the Ducks, who left the court at halftime trailing 47-23.

Four players scored in double-figures for the Boilermakers, while three Oregon starters (Randy Grant, Greg Senior, and Rick Osborn) were held scoreless.

"Obviously, we're a little disappointed in our performance. We knew going in we had to handle their pressure, and we didn't handle it at all," said Oregon coach Don Monson in a post-game wire service interview. "To me, there's no excuse for some of the defense we played and some of the turnovers we committed."

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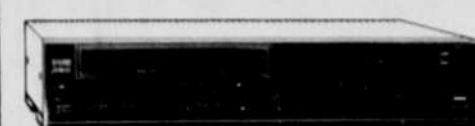
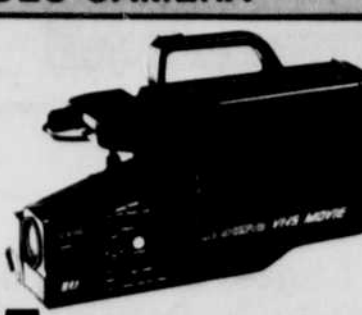
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
