love our kids." "There seems to be an unnecessary fear of the nuclear free zone," Zupan said at the rally. "I think it's time for the folks in the community, especially our elected officials, to realize that this can be good for the community."

During the work session, Bennett stressed that the city attorney's proposal was as restrictive as any nuclear free zone ordinance in the United States. "Are there good reasons to go way beyond that?" Bennett asked.

Bennett also admonished the council to take a position on the two proposals because failure to do so would show a lack of respect for the task force's efforts.

"I don't think it makes sense

although he added he could possibly back a motion to refer the issue back to voters again.

"I don't believe in unilateral disarmament," Miller said.

According to City Councilman Freeman Holmer, the ordinance began on the heels of an initiative process, so "we should clearly put this back in the laps of the voters."

"Regardless of what we do, we should send this back to the voters," said City Councilwoman Debra Ehrman. "I don't see it as our proposal."

When Mayor Brian Obie pressed Ehrman over what proposal she favored, Ehrman said, "If you want to pin me down, I'd go with A (MRV)."

City Councilwoman Cynthia Wooten also sided with the MRV, although she, too,

Voters should be presented with both proposals as written, City Councilwoman Emily Schue said. "The question here is how to keep faith with the citizens of Eugene who spoke to us once before," she said.

City Councilwoman Ruth Bascom adopted a middle ground during the discussion.

"It's frustrating for the City Council to get this report unresolved," Bascom said. Bascom said she believed only the scope of each proposal should be returned to voters since that was the major unresolved difference.

for the council to redraft the entire ordinance," he said.

City councilmen Roger Rutan and Jeffrey Miller also sided with Bennett. Rutan said the MRV did not address many of the legal problems the task force was charged to clear up.

"Proposal A (MRV) is clearly ambiguous and is clearly anti-business," Rutan said. "It'll send out that message loud and clear. Let's not make any bones about that."

Miller, on the other hand, said his convictions forced him to support the Bennett proposal,

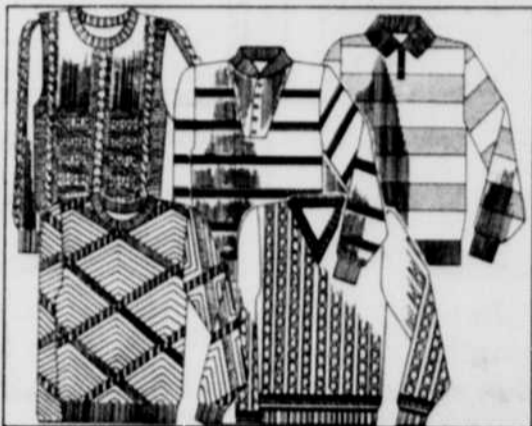
favored referring the proposals back to the voters.

The original ordinance was passed by a majority of voters, Wooten said, and it would be an insult to them if the council decided for them.

"Give them a chance to show us they knew what they were doing the first time," she said.

However, Wooten supported an appointed nuclear free zone board instead of an elected one. The MRV states the board shall be elected, while the other proposal opts for an appointed board.
