currently about 10,000 acres of old-growth and mature timber per year," Anderson said.

The alternate plans have old-growth areas (remaining at the end of 50 years) ranging from 655,000 to 354,000 acres. The preferred plan will retain 509,000 acres of old-growth after 50 years.

Kerrick and his committees have been working on the draft plan since November 1980. In

the next four months, Kerrick is looking forward to interaction with the public, he said.

"We think the one (plan) we selected as preferred is the best, but we're sure as heck interested in what you have to say," he said.

Kerrick emphasized that their preferred alternative plan is their best attempt to balance all resources. "Our forest plan is issue driven," he added.

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
