

Scholar redefines modern thought

As a result of the possibility of nuclear holocaust, a new political thinking has emerged that makes peace a top priority, according to Guenther Rose, a Fulbright fellow visiting the University from East Berlin.

Guenther, one of three scholars to receive the first Fulbright fellowships ever

awarded to citizens of the German Democrat Republic, spoke on the issue of "New Modes of Thinking in the Nuclear Age," on Wednesday in the EMU.

"The present era is in two ways a turning point," Rose said, referring to the fact that the world has enough resources to meet basic human needs and at the same time the potential to wipe out the entire human race.

In a world where 40,000 children die every day in

underdeveloped countries, a change in political thinking is necessary, according to Rose.

"We should be aware that while I am speaking ten children have died," he said.

This new mode of thinking is characterized by several points with peace as the number one priority, according to Rose. "Peace has become the final condition for human ex-

groups, so the kids talk them over with the drivers," she added.

Volunteers are asked to commit to at least 10 to 12 weeks of driving through the duration of the therapy sessions, Paaso said.

Drivers will work in groups of two so that while one person is driving, the other is free to talk with the patients. This is intended to give the children a greater sense of stability, she said.

Paaso said this sense of stability is especially important during the third and fourth weeks of therapy. This is when the patients really "start dealing with what's happened to them," she added.

O'Brien called this the "power-control period," or a period of "acting out." This is when the therapists start

"working out" the children's feelings about what has happened to them, she said. Sometimes these feelings don't come out during the group session, so the children will let them out during the ride home, she said.

"This is a scary time for kids" who have never had this kind of experience, she said.

"We don't expect them (the drivers) to handle these situations like we would," she said — "The expectation is that they handle it in a common-sense fashion."

Perhaps one of the most important things clients get out of these sessions is a feeling of "normalization," O'Brien said. Children no longer feel that they are estranged from other peers — they find out others feel the same way they do, she said.

With the teen groups, O'Brien said clients often recognize

other peers who have gone through some of the same experiences and who have turned out alright, presenting a positive role model.

The sessions, though not always completely successful, help with the immediate situation, O'Brien said. "They help plant some seeds for the future," she added.

Soliciting volunteers to drive the vans was not an easy task, according to Lynn Flinders, a volunteer specialist with the Department of Human Resources Volunteer Program. When she first attempted to get volunteers for the program, she did not receive much of a response.

"When people think of volunteering, they don't think of transportation," she said. "They don't think of driving buses and vans."


