

EPD makes arrest after assault

The Eugene Police Department arrested a man on Wednesday in connection with the rape of a female University student. Jamie L. Wilson, 20, is being held at the Lane County Jail on a charge of first degree rape. Bail has been set at \$3,000.

The rape occurred early Wednesday morning in a house located in the 900 block of Patterson Street, according to Tim Birr, EPD public information officer.

Wilson, who had met the vic-

tim briefly about a week before, allegedly came to the house asking for a place to stay. Police reports indicate Wilson claimed he had been kicked out of the house he was staying in at the time.

The victim let Wilson in the house and talked to him briefly. When she refused to let him stay with her, Wilson allegedly pulled a knife on her and raped her. When the victim started screaming, Wilson allegedly fled through a window, leaving his clothes in the house.

Before leaving the victim's house, Wilson was reported to have acquired a woman's black coat and a pair of tan pants, according to Birr, who said the EPD is seeking further information on this.

Police officers were called to the scene, where they found identification on Wilson's clothes that allowed them to contact "some associates" of Wilson, Birr said. Police later arrested Wilson at his temporary residence on 374 West Second Street.

Grand opening set for Saturday

The University's Natural History Museum, closed to the public after the razing of its original location, will celebrate its grand opening Saturday in a new building.

University President Paul Olum officially will dedicate the new museum in a ceremony highlighted by traditional Native American rituals. The opening, which is free to the public, begins at 2 p.m., Dec. 12 at the facility's new location at 1680 E. 15th Ave., across from the Bean Complex residence hall.

The Natural History Museum originally was located in a former shop area for the University's Physical Plant. The original building was demolished to make room for the construction of the new \$45.6 million science complex.

A \$485,000 grant from the federal Department of Energy helped defray the cost of the new structure. In addition, \$150,000 worth of contributions from private parties helped make the new museum a reality.

The museum will display two exhibits during its grand opening.

"Timeless Vision," a collection of more than a dozen paintings by Eugene artist Allen Cox, was created especially for the grand opening. Cox uses prehistoric drawings as his model for life-size air brush paintings.

The paintings composing the "Timeless Vision" exhibit will be on sale during its display in the museum's lobby, which will continue through Jan. 30, 1988. Cox said he will donate 30 per-

cent of his profits from the sale to the museum.

The museum's other exhibit, "The Golden Peninsula: Three Traditional Cultures of Southeast Asia," will contain a collection of artifacts, ranging from hand-made ornaments, instruments and everyday household articles from the countries of Burma and Thailand.

In addition to the exhibits, a slide show documenting the

construction of the new museum will be presented during the opening.

Starting Saturday, the museum will have special holiday hours every day from noon to 5 p.m. until Wednesday, Dec. 23. The facility will be closed from Thursday, Dec. 24, through Monday, Jan. 4, for winter break. Next term, regular museum hours will begin, from noon to 5 p.m. on Tuesdays through Saturday excluding state and University holidays.
