Lane County to enact clean air standards

New, tougher federal air quality standards, recently enacted by the Environmental Protection Agency, are causing Lane County officials to reevaluate local anti-pollution restrictions in order to improve air quality to meet the new standards.

The Lane Regional Air Pollution Authority Advisory Committee held a public forum on emission controls at the Springfield City Hall Wednesday night in order to gain public input.

The committee will soon choose specific control measures to reduce particulate levels in the Eugene-Springfield area. These measures will focus on local particulate sources — industry, road dust, backyard burning and home woodheating.

Local residents speaking at the forum voiced divergent

views on potential emission controls.

David Spies, plant supervisor at Oregon Industrial Lumber Products, said domestic woodheating, rather than industrial emissions, was the primary source of air pollution in Lane County. He called for the licensing of all wood stoves in the county at a cost of \$25 to \$50 per stove, per year. Spies said licensing the county's 40,000 wood stoves could bring in millions of dollars and greatly control woodburning devices.

Eugene resident Michael Copely concurred with the licensing idea, saying he was "tired of breathing other people's garbage."

Jim Holm, a member of the Lane County Boiler Owners Association, said potential pollution controls could place a heavy burden on local industry. He said it could cost as much as \$1.5 million to convert some

State parks accepting camping reservations

It's only January, but students wanting to spend Memorial Day at one of the state camping areas can begin reserving campsites as soon as this Monday.

Starting Jan. 11, reservation applications will be accepted for some of the popular parks in Oregon. And according to Suzie Haylock, from the state parks headquarters in Salem, it is definitely a good idea to plan ahead and reserve a space before heading to the nearest camping area.

"You can try (to get a campsite without a reservation) but your chances are not going to be red-hot," she said.

Haylock said the most popular camping areas, such as Detroit Lake and parks along the coast, usually fill up for Memorial Day as early as the second week of April.

Last year, more than 50,000 reservations were processed by the state's 3,100 parks that accept reservations. Reservations only are accepted for Memorial Day through Labor Day.

"Before that, it's first come, first serve," Haylock said.

In addition to crowds, campers also will face a \$1 camping fee increase. The increase

will go into effect May 9, the day summer rates begin.

Currently, the price for a campsite ranges from \$7 to \$10 during the summer. During the winter season, from Labor Day to May 9, the rates range from \$5 to \$8. The winter season's rates will not change.

Haylock said that the increase was a result of the state parks' recent decision to stop charging campers from outside Oregon an additional \$2 fee.

Reservation applications are available at the state park offices, or also are likely to be found at the Motor Vehicles Division Office, the Oregon State Police Office, and at chamber of commerce offices.

All reservations should be addressed to the particular park the camper is interested in, Haylock stressed, not to the state park headquarters. Enclosed with the application should be a check or money order for \$10, covering the \$3 non-refundable reservation fee and part of the payment for the first night's camping fee.

The parks where reservations may be made include The Cove Palisades, Wallowa Lake, Detroit Lake, Beachside, Beverly Beach, South Beach, Devil's Lake, the Prineville Reservoir, Honeyman, Fort Stevens, Harris Beach, and Cape Lookout.
