

Elections court order rescinded

The ASUO Constitution Court met Friday night and lifted an injunction against the ASUO Elections Board.

The injunction was lifted at the former ASUO vice president Ron Munion's request, the person who originally requested the injunction. Munion then withdrew both his suits against the ASUO Elections Board.

Munion said he would seek an interpretation of the election rules after the elections to

clarify if a vice presidential candidate could automatically assume the presidential ticket should the presidential candidate be forced out.

"I think it would be good for students to know if that can be done so that this problem may never occur again," he told the court.

Court members then wrote an official statement lifting the injunction on the elections.

Afterwards, Munion offered members of the ASUO Elections Board a written statement of his withdrawal.

ASUO Elections Board Chairwoman Barbra Hankins later said the "Voters' Guide," originally scheduled as an insert in today's Oregon Daily Emerald, will be in Friday's edition instead.

"We're sorry for any inconvenience this has caused," Hankins said.

dent participation than what the LTD measure would.

The committee also rejected Ballot Measure 84. The measure, if approved, would allow student government officials the right to hold multiple positions without having to seek ASUO Constitution Court approval unless petitioned.

The committee endorsed Ballot Measures 81, 83, 85, 86 and 87, Davis said.

Ballot Measure 81, proposed by the Oregon Student Public Interest Research Group, asks students for \$2 a student a term to generate a total of \$96,000 for its operating budget.

Davis added he wanted to stress the endorsement committee was acting at the best interest of the entire University, and not just in favor of the Greek community.

Ballot Measure 83, an Oregon Daily Emerald special request, asks students to support a one-time allocation of \$1.90 a student a term. A total of \$98,080 would be raised to replace the current operating system, which is nine years old and of limited repair ability.

"We do support for the simple fact we feel it's an ongoing thing. They've (the Oregon Daily Emerald) continued to show an exceptional amount of quality, and it's an excellent means of information on campus," he said.

Davis said the committee concluded that the increase, when spread over a 10-year period of time, is minimal.

The committee also endorsed Ballot Measures 85 and 86, which would revise the ASUO Constitution to help create a more efficient student government, Davis said.

The Greek Endorsement Committee also approved Ballot Measure 87, which would benefit the University Counseling Center. If approved, the measure would raise a total of \$23,000 for the center.

"It's a 'Yes!' on this one," Davis said, explaining the committee believes this measure will serve all students at the University well.

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
