

University starts Super Weekend

Amidst a flurry of yearly campus activities, the University will launch Super Weekend today, a combination of community events and the beginning of the five-year, \$60-million campaign for the University.

The campaign will begin at 11:30 a.m. Saturday with a kick-off speech by William Boyd, former University president, followed by an All-University Awards buffet for Parents' Weekend that will honor exceptional students.

The campaign has been in the planning stages for a year and now is the time for the University to show its pride, said University President Paul Olum.

"As with all capital campaigns there is always a quiet portion first with private individuals coming forward with donations. Now we are presenting the campaign for the public," Olum said.

In addition to Saturday's events, there will be several activities going on today in conjunction with the fund-raiser,

said Jennifer Stewart, University News Bureau representative. From 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., visiting parents will have the opportunity to attend classes with students.

In addition, Schafer Hall in Walton Complex, the Museum of Art, and the Museum of Natural History will all hold art shows that will be open to the public. There will also be a street fair on 13th Avenue between University and Kincaid streets sponsored by the ASUO.

Stewart said the campaign was scheduled to coincide with several other yearly events on campus, including Peace Week, Greek Week and SpringFest. This way visiting alumni can enjoy the animated spirit of the community while it is in full swing, she said.
