people but is initiated at a corporate level, he insisted. "It's about big fish eating up little fish. For the paper workers in Halsey, Oregon, or the farmers in Greenville, Iowa, it's about barracudas with little eyes, big mouths, sharp teeth and insatiable appetites. Let's stop barracudas from eating up all the people," he said.

As usual, Jackson found time to slam Reaganomics and the proposed economic agendas of his rival candidates, Vice President George Bush and Massachusetts Gov. Michael Dukakis.

"Bush says sustain Reaganomics. Dukakis says manage Reaganomics. I say change and end Reaganomics," Jackson said.

Reaganomics, he continued, translates to "corporates up, wages down, plants closed and workers abandoned." He described the president's economic philosophy as "the exact reverse of Robin Hood: taking from the poor and giving to the rich, and paid for by the middle class."

Jackson also blamed Reaganomics for creating the nation's large budget deficit and trade imbalance.

"Enough of Reaganomics, you need Jackson action," he said.

The Chicago democrat disapproved of the Reagan administration's approach to foreign affairs. "We have a strong military, but we have weak policies," he said. "Our military in Latin America is strong, our policies are weak. The \$10 million we spent chasing free-wheeling Sandinistas should have been spent chasing poverty, illiteracy and disease."

Jackson suggested freezing the military budget for five years in order to save \$60 billion. "Two more (aircraft) carriers at \$36 billion will not make us more secure," he said.

Reinvest in America, repeated Jackson, offering what he believes are obvious, simple and essential solutions to unemployment. "If we build houses for the homeless there will be jobs for the jobless. Let's put America back to work."

Jackson added that America must stay working by preventing high school and college students from dropping out of school and by boosting financial support for teachers and education programs. "I say double the education budget," he said.

He also said he wants to raise the minimum wage.

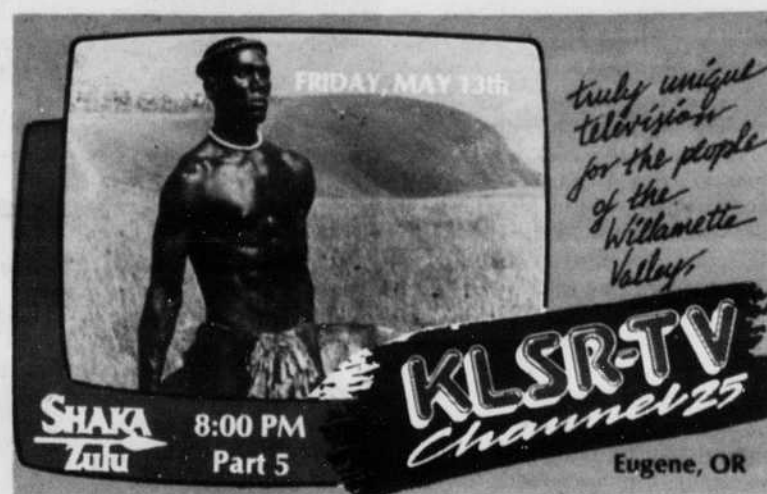
"Half of the nation's poor children live in a house headed by a woman where there is no man," Jackson said. "A woman

makes 65 cents for every dollar a man makes. Women cannot get a loaf of bread cheaper, women cannot get a carton of milk cheaper. Women deserve equal work and pay equity."

Jackson made campaign stops Thursday in Woodburn, Corvallis and Halsey before arriv-

ing on campus.

The traveling campaign also swept through Medford and Central Point on Thursday night before leaving the state for California. Jackson has vowed to campaign hard for the June 7 primaries there and in Montana, New Jersey and New Mexico.
