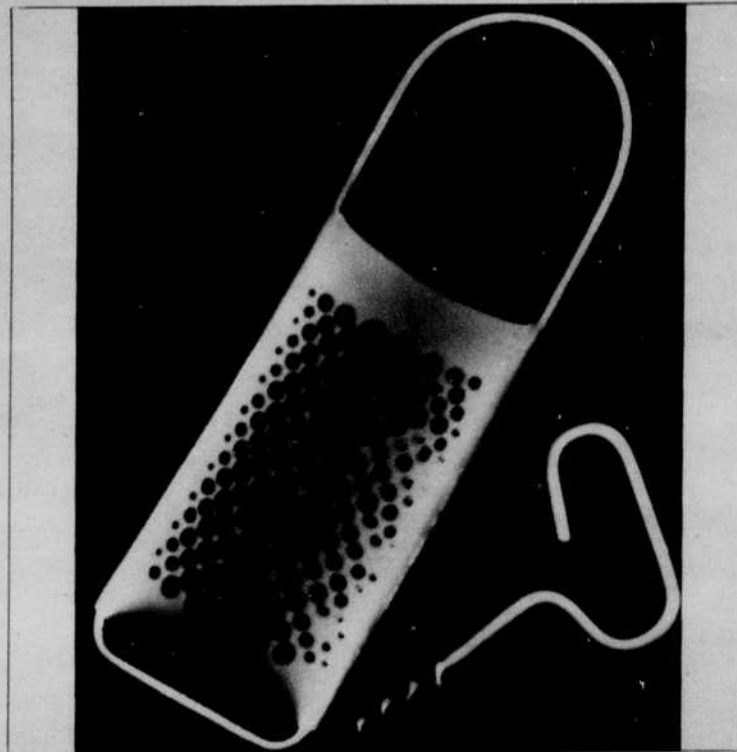

## 'Merrily We Roll ...' gets flat on the way

Mainstage Cabaret's production of Steven Sondheim's "Merrily We Roll Along" has some bright moments but hardly rolls along.

The repetitive score, the strained performances of two of the leads and the wandering plot make the production a

disappointment.

Based on the original play by George S. Kaufman and Moss Hart, "Merrily" chronicles in reverse order the 25-year friendship of Mary Flynn, Frank Shepard and Charley Kringas (played by Kimberly Robinson, Brad Goodman and Eric James Hadley, respectively). The play opens in 1980 with Frank, a famous Broadway composer, delivering the commencement speech to his alma mater's newest graduating class. The production then moves backward year by year until the audience discovers how the three friends met in the late 1950s.

Twelve different scenes, in two acts, reveal the complexities of success and how it
