The good news is that the covers are really fun - Wilbert Harrison's "Let's Stick Together" has the right amount of bite to it, while "Shenandoah" is fine acoustic Dylan. His singing has deteriorated a bit (he sounds like he smokes too much) but despite its blemishes and short running time, Down in the Groove is definitely worth having.




