Schnitzer resigns board; denotes commitments

Arlene Schnitzer of Portland has resigned from the 11-member Oregon State Board of Higher Education, effective Oct.1.

Schnitzer, appointed to the board in 1987 by Gov. Neil Goldschmidt, cited "personal commitments" in a Sept. 23 letter to the governor.

There are some personal commitments that have arisen at this particular time, and they must take precedence in my life," Schnitzer said through a statement released Thursday.

She said her decision was not affected by controversy in the state system. Schnitzer and fellow board member and former ASUO President Kasey Brooks, were the only members who did not support the board's decision to force University President Paul Olum into early retirement.

"In my years of community service, I have faced much controversy and have never avoided decisions," she wrote. "Controversy usually means change is occurring. That is exactly what is happening within the Oregon State System of Higher Education, and I wish that I could be part of the positive change taking place."


