straight decisions to put the meet away: George Johnston 6-2 over Trent Flack at 150 lbs.; Eric Messner 7-2 over Mike Murphy at 158 lbs.; Chris Jones 5-3 over Larry Roof at 167 lbs.; and Curt Strahm 11-6 over Paul Hamilton at 177 lbs.

Fred King gave the Beavers their final points with a 16-6 major decision over Joe Rissone at 190 lbs., then Oregon's James Knott scored a 17-5 major decision over Matt Willhite in the heavyweight division to finish off the meet and the Beavers.

Most of the wrestlers and the 534 in attendance were surprisingly subdued for a Civil War, but Finley attributed that to the relative ease with which Oregon won the meet

"That was because we pretty well dominated them," he said. "As soon as you start scoring lots of points, it makes it not quite so exciting."

The Beavers, who lost earlier in the day to Portland State 23-18 in Corvallis, fell to 0-9-1, 0-1-0 in the Pac-10.

Finley said the fact that Oregon State had wrestled earlier in the day had no effect on the outcome, other than possibly helping the Beavers because they were already warmed up and ready to wrestle.

The Ducks, ranked 22nd nationally in the latest coaches poll, get a break from competition until New Year's Eve, when they begin a string of one all-day tournament and five dual meets in six days. The trip begins with the California State-Fullerton Tournament on Dec. 31, followed by Pac-10 duals at CS-Fullerton on Jan. 2, Fresno State on Jan. 3, CS-Bakersfield on Jan. 4 and Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo on Jan. 5.

The road trip ends with a tough dual against Oklahoma, Jan. 5 at San Luis Obispo, Calif.

The Ducks return home Jan. 9 for a Pac-10 dual against Boise State at 7:30 p.m. at Mac Court.






