

Anne Morrison, who graduated from the law school in 1988 and now is working for Legal Aid Service of Lane County Inc., complained about the way the law school deals with racial issues, particularly the hiring of minorities.

The law school currently has only one minority professor, who is visiting from China. But visiting professors just "don't cut the muster," Morrison said.

"To have visiting professors doesn't fill the commitment that hiring a permanent minority faculty would," she said.

Permanent minority faculty appointments would provide minority students role models and offer different viewpoints about law. White students also would have to confront stereotypes, she said.

Law school administrators and faculty say they are working on the problem of getting more minority law professors, but are hampered by budget constraints.

"The faculty should not rest until we get more permanent minority faculty," said assistant law professor Martha Schweitz. "I hope students have some idea that we're trying."

But, she added, the school "overextended" itself by hiring Schuman and Doug Branson, another visiting white professor turned permanent faculty member. Branson will begin teaching in the fall.

Former Dean Bell, who re-

turned to Harvard shortly after leaving the University in 1985, said he didn't know all the details surrounding the Schuman controversy or the current state of racial tensions at the law school. But he said he would be surprised if the school was racist, and he offered an explanation as to why the school has trouble recruiting minority professors.

"Racism in any place should not be a surprise, but I think I would be a bit more surprised to find it at Oregon."

"I think that what happens in Oregon and in a lot of other places with regard to hiring teachers, is that on one hand there's a genuine interest in hiring teachers of color. On the other hand, there's a lot of ambivalence about 'is this the right person, or is there going to be more of a problem if this person doesn't work out,'" Bell said.

Regardless of the situation, "race relations are always very

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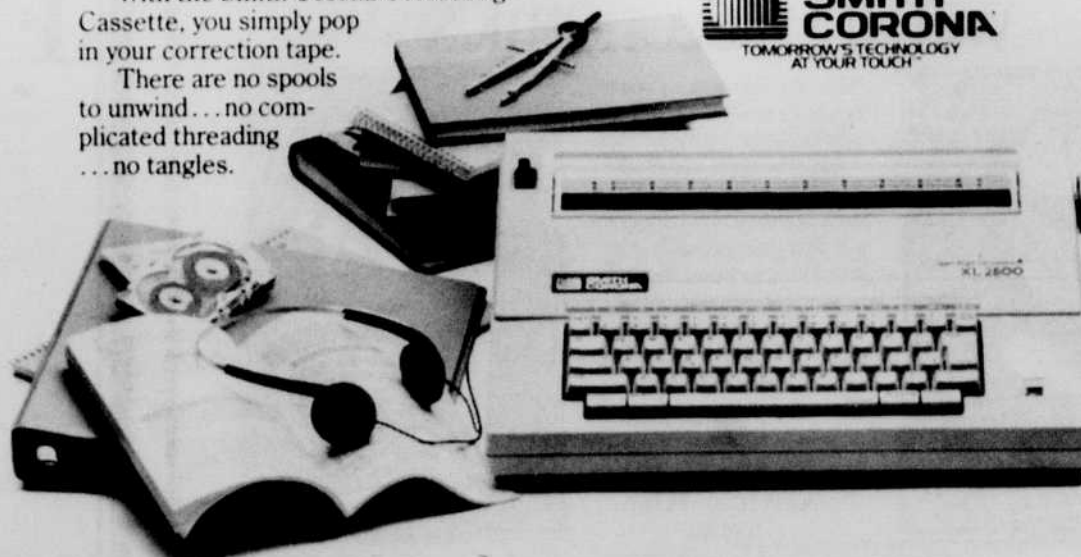
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
