Southwell, Medler to address domestic and foreign policies

The future United States domestic policies and foreign affairs will be considered as two University professors discuss "The Next Four Years in American Politics" during a University Forum tonight at 7:30 p.m. in the Composer's Hall of the Eugene Conference Center.

Jerry Medler and Priscilla Southwell, two University political science associate professors, will analyze the 1988 presidential and congressional elections and what the outcome

may mean for U.S. citizens over the next four years and beyond.

Southwell will concentrate on Bush's proposed foreign policy while Medler will discuss the administration's future domestic plans.

Medler teaches a variety of political science classes at the University, focusing primarily on internal U.S. politics, power

and influence.

Southwell teaches a class on U.S. foreign policy at the University.

"I see it (the forum) as an opportunity for a 'town-gown' event where academics share their particular perspectives with other non-academic people," Medler said.

A 1963 graduate of Northwestern University, Medler received his doctoral degree in political science from the University in 1966. He spent the next two years completing post-doctoral work at the University of Michigan before joining the University faculty in 1968.

In addition to teaching, Medler has advised a variety of national, state and county panels and commissions. He also has served as a visiting professor at two Brazilian universities and as an adviser to the People's Republic of China.

Southwell joined the University faculty in 1981 and received her doctorate from the University of North Carolina in 1983. She earned her bachelor's degree in 1974 and her master's degree in 1977 from the University of Colorado. Her teaching centers on American politics and political behavior and theory.

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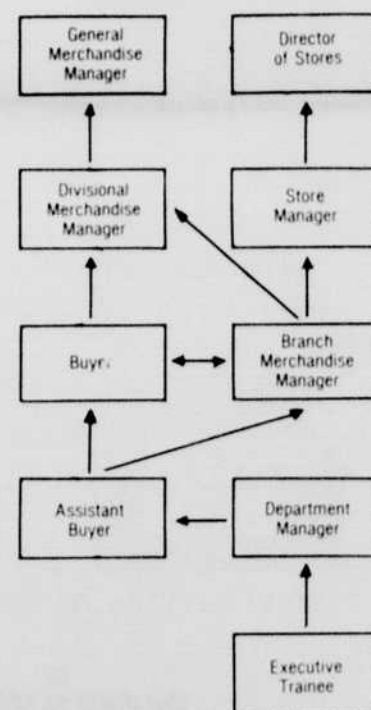
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
