

Surprise postponement limits IFC agenda

The Incidental Fee Committee on Monday held its shortest meeting of the year.

The Committee, after 30 minutes, allocated a total of \$6,867 to two student groups before

adjourning early in commemoration of Martin Luther King Jr. Day.

Committee members unanimously allocated \$2,917 to Women in Transition, a 3 percent increase from their previous year's budget of \$2,822. In addition, they allocated a total

of \$3,950 to Switchboard/Info Line, increasing the group's budget by 2 percent from last year's budget of \$3,870.

"I know that this is a big inconvenience," said IFC member Tim Hughes to representatives of four groups scheduled to present their budgets.

"But today is an important symbolic day, and I don't think we should be meeting on Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday when his son (Martin Luther King III) is speaking about a mile away from here," he added.

Hughes was referring to a speech given by King's son Monday evening at 8 p.m. in The Hult Center for the Performing Arts in downtown Eugene.

Despite the fervor of Hughes' appeal, individual committee members expressed reservations at the appropriateness of canceling a budget hearing on such short notice.

"I understand that it's important to recognize today as an important day but I also feel that it is inappropriate to have

this many people show up at the meeting and then call it off," said IFC Chairwoman J. Lauren Norris.

Approximately 10 students showed up at the start of last night's IFC meeting, and representatives from two groups — Women in Transition and Switchboard/Info Line — expressed strong reservations at rescheduling their budget hearings.

Switchboard/Info Line is a student ride-sharing program operated by White Bird Clinic.

"I had to arrange childcare support, work extra hours and come from out-of-town to make this hearing," said Julie Odell, White Bird Clinic information specialist. "I wish that I had known about this (possible meeting postponement) earlier."

As a result, IFC members agreed to hear all groups that were "completely inconvenienced by not having their budgets heard tonight." Women in Transition and Switchboard/Info Line were allowed to present their budgets and the meeting was then adjourned.

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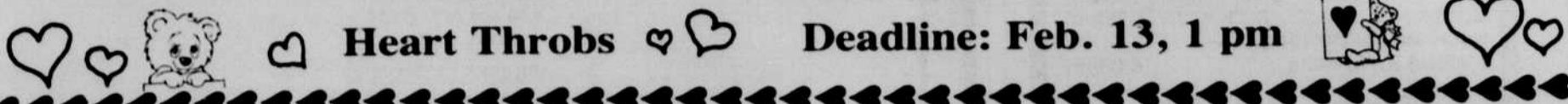
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
