vention. If industries keep polluting like they are now, then the cost of cleaning up will be out of their scope," Lovie said.

According to Justin McKenna, the project leader for the legislative action alliance, OSPIRG will continue to solicit support from the Legislature and the public.

"As it becomes more and

more debated, we will do a lot of lobbying to make people aware of the issue," McKenna said.

The bill calls for performance standards to decrease the use of toxins, public participation in forcing compliance with toxin quotas, and a hazardous substance fee to be paid by businesses using dangerous toxins.

McKenna called the bill "very new" and said industry may try to make amendments that would lessen the impact of the bill, something he says he will work to avoid.

"We want the bill to be powerful when it comes out," McKenna said.

Lovie said she is hopeful in light of the strong lobbyist turnout in Salem.

"We made an impact through participation today. I'm confident the bill will pass because we have citizen support behind us," Lovie said.

the parking structure's 900 spaces will be underground.

Cost of the parking structure is estimated at \$7 million, and the medical office building is estimated at \$8 million.

Construction on the project began last May. The parking

structure is expected to be completed by April, and construction of the medical office is scheduled to start in May, Reed said. He said the two lower levels of the parking structure would be open to the public in May.

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
