

Police Beat

The following is a list of campus-area crimes reported to the Office of Public Safety and the Eugene Police Department Jan. 23 - 30:

- Three males, one of them a University student, were cited for second-degree theft after OPS officers observed them walking in the Science V construction area in the early morning hours of Jan. 19.

- Chains, copper fittings and other equipment belonging to employees of the Wildish Construction Co. were found on the suspects.

- An unknown suspect entered the unlocked room of two sleeping University Inn residents and reportedly stole a purse Jan. 21. One of the victims found the purse the next morning, missing \$15 cash.

- Two University students playing racquetball at Esslinger Gym had their clothing and credit cards stolen

by unknown suspects Jan. 22. The items had been placed outside the court door. OPS and EPD also report a related incident in which another University student had her clothes, including a \$250 jacket, stolen from outside an Esslinger racquetball court.

- Burglars broke into the ceramics room, 1385 Franklin Blvd., and stole about \$500 worth of equipment and personal belongings Jan. 25. The suspects entered the room through an unlocked door, EPD reports.

- University groundskeepers found some of the stolen items outside the building. Others, including a portable radio and a cassette player, were not recovered.

- A \$300 camera was stolen Jan. 26 from a car parked in the Bean Complex parking lot.

- In addition, OPS reports 10 bikes stolen, and one recovered.

Fee committee allocates \$8,300

Slow but steady growth continued to be a theme Monday in the Incidental Fee Committee's distribution of student funds, as it allocated \$8,300 to four student groups.

The largest budget increase approved was given to the Latin American Support Committee, which received \$3,262, a 6.5 percent increase from this year's budget of \$3,063.

The amount was a compromise from the original budget request of \$4,857 the committee received earlier.

The committee also decided to allocate \$1,129 to the Solar Energy Center, a 10 percent decrease from its current budget of \$1,255.

According to IFC member Jack Maynard, the primary reason for the cut was the committee's concern over the group's previous spending patterns.

In 1987-88, the group returned \$263 to the IFC's surplus accounts, Maynard said. "This is a lot of money to wash back, and we're concerned that this does not happen again."

In other matters, the committee allocated \$2,525 to the Amazon Community Tenants, and \$1,384 to People of the Oregon Coast. Neither was increased over current budget allocations.

The committee also postponed its hearing of Telecommunication and Films Association's (TCFA) budget until Monday, when all members of the committee could be present.

Committee members also expressed concern over their ability to fund TCFA because of the "ambiguity" that surrounded several of the group's programs as well as its shaky organizational structure, which recently underwent a change in officers.

"It's a problem for me to not know where the program is going," said IFC chairwoman J. Lauren Norris.

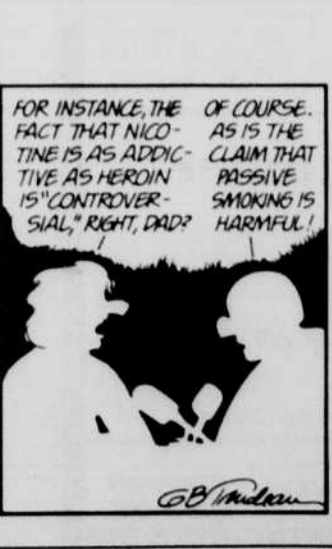
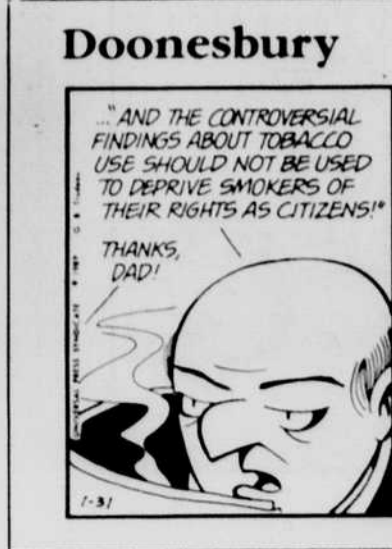
