Campus hosts Model U.N.

About 600 high school students from all areas of Oregon will be on campus today through Sunday taking part in the 40th Annual Model United Nations conference.

According to a release from the Oregon High School International Relations League, each student comes to the conference to represent a selected country's views on one of seven committees of the General Assembly.

The delegates, representing Albanians to Zimbabweans, will debate issues such as apartheid, disarmament, ozone layer depletion, the problem of the Palestinian Homeland, the issue of refugees, and international trade and debt crisis.

Delegates will read policy statements representing the positions of their country and after debate, they attempt to pass resolutions to solve specific problems, the release stated.

The resolutions then will be sent to the U.N. General Assembly for confirmation or rejection.

A packet of all the resolutions passed by the assembly will be sent to Oregon senators and representatives, the U.N. Association of the United States, the United Nations and participating high schools in hopes that teen views on world issues will become more visible.

Many of this year's delegates are taking the role-playing very seriously.

The PLO ambassador, a senior from Jefferson High School, is growing out his beard and wearing a checked keffiyeh like Yasser Arafat, the release stated.

Christopher Fox, a Lincoln High School senior, started early by meeting with Arafat last summer in Tunisia and going on a 10-day fact-finding mission to Israel on Rabbi Joshua Stampfer's Witnesses for Middle East Peace Study Tour, the release stated.

The conference is sponsored by the Oregon High School International Relations League, the oldest student organization in the state.
