

# Men's golf team makes regionals

The Oregon men's golf team has been selected to compete in the NCAA West-ern Regional, May 25-27 in El Paso, Texas.

The Ducks were one of 16 teams selected to compete in the West Regional, one of three regional playoffs being held.

The top nine teams in the West Regional will advance to the NCAA Tournament, to be held June 7-10 in Ed-

mond, Okla.

Coach Scott Krieger will take Chris Holzgang, Bob Rannow, Tom Smith, Troy Tamiya and one other player to the West Regional.

Oregon finished tied for fourth in the Pacific-10 Conference championships with USC. The last time the Ducks advanced to post-season play was in 1987, when they finished 30th at the NCAAs.

umpires how I set up and which shoulder to be behind," Cavanaugh said. "Usually after three innings the umpires have figured out that I'm left-handed. I'm sure since we're going to Massachusetts that I'll have to talk to the umpires and let them know."

"She has some disadvantages," Wilson said. "It's pretty tough for her to pick off a runner at third base with a right-handed batter at the plate. I think her skill level more than makes up for it. She learns really quickly."

While Cavanaugh was a "lit-

tle disappointed" that the fourth-ranked, fifth-seeded Ducks aren't hosting a first-round NCAA regional, she is looking forward to heading to Massachusetts and Oregon's first-ever post-season appearance.

"I was disappointed when I first heard," admitted Cavanaugh, "because my whole family would have been coming down and we were all excited. We've been home for a while now and I'm thrilled and excited to travel and see new things. I think we'll be a little more intense because we're go-

ing into something new."

"I think we got a good draw," she added, referring to 17th-seeded Connecticut and 19th-seeded Massachusetts. "We just need to stay consistent and execute. We have so many options and are talented all the way through."

Win or lose, Wilson likes what the future holds for her southpaw catcher.

"She's never had to work hard, because things come naturally to her," Wilson said. "She's improved a lot this season, but it's scary to think how good she could be."
