Smith has the Pac-10's top mark in the javelin and is looking for her first conference crown. Smith has had a very solid season and could throw over 190 feet this weekend.

In the distance races, Liz Wilson and Stephanie Wessell own the top two marks in the 5,000. Wilson is also a strong title threat in the 3,000, but will probably only run one event.

School record holder Phillis McKinney owns the top triple jump mark by more than a foot,

and should easily win that competition.

Sprinter Rosie Williams probably also will run only one individual event. Williams will either run the 100 or 200 and is looking for a conference title as well as an NCAA-qualifying time.

Williams also will run on both relays. The 400-meter relay team owns the fastest time in the conference (45.50) and is also shooting for an NCAA qualifying mark.
