## Jarrett, Graves, Musgrave given honors for athletic achievements

University student athletes Glenn Jarrett, Penny Graves and Bill Musgrave were the award winners Tuesday afternoon at the annual University athletic awards banquet held in the EMU Ballroom.

Jarrett, a senior on the wrestling team, was award the Emerald Athletic Trophy, estab-lished in 1951 and jointly sponsored by the University Athletic Department and the Oregon Daily Emerald.

The award is given annually to a University student-athlete based on outstanding achievement in the fields of athletics. scholarship and citizenship.

Jarrett, from Missoula, Mont., ranks second on Oregon's all-time career victory list with 110. He captured the Pacific-10 Conference titles his freshman and senior years and qualified for the NCAA all four seasons while competing at Oregon. Jarrett finished seventh at this year's NCAA Championships and completed the season

An All-American this year, larrett has been a scholar athlete (3.81 GPA) with a major in physical education and a minor in biology and chemistry at Oregon and will be pursuing his medical degree at the Oregon Health Sciences University this coming fall.

Jarrett served on the Team Council, was student director for Volunteers for Youth and served on the search committee for the Athletic Department's Primary Women's Administrator. In addition, he was a guest speaker at local schools and civic groups.

Penny Graves was the recipient of the Jackson Award given to the top female scholar-athlete at the University.

Graves, from Port Angeles, Wash., is a three-time cross All-American earned the same distinction three times in track.

Graves was a two-time Pac-10 Champion in the 1,500 meters and had a GPA of 3.34 when she graduated winter term with a major in physical education.

This year's Doyle Higdon Memorial Trophy went to Oregon quarterback Bill Musgrave. who led the Ducks to a 5-0 start before suffering a broken collar-bone against Arizona State. forcing him to miss the remainder of the season.

The Higdon award, established in 1955 in honor of former football and track star Doyle Higdon, is awarded annually to an Oregon athlete for excellence in athletics, scholarship and citizenship. The award is sponsored by the sophomore and junior classes and is presented at the end of the sophomore year.

Musgrave was named to the Pac-10 All-Academic team and has maintained a 3.55 GPA.

Ken Smith, University of Washington's assistant basketball coach for the last four years, has accepted a similar position at Oregon, head basketball coach Don Monson said Tuesday

Smith, 34, has served on Andy Russo's staff at Washington, working in the areas of recruiting, academics and housing since 1985.

"We feel very fortunate to have Ken joining our basketball staff," Monson said. "He's a class act with a great deal of coaching and recruiting experience. Ken has been a proven recruiter in the Pac-10 and we are particularly anxious to have him help us in that area.

Prior to his four-year stint at Washington, Smith was an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Montana State for two seasons and a former member of the basketball staff at the University of San Francisco for

three years.

After graduation from the University of San Diego, he coached in two Bay Area high schools and Skyline Community College in San Bruno, Calif.

In addition, he was a fouryear starter and was drafted by the Golden State Warriors in the 10th round of the 1976 National Basketball Association. He played one season in Europe

"I'm elated and thankful to be able to stay in the Pac-10. the top league on the West Coast." Smith said. "The icing on the cake for me is that my parents live in Eugene, and we really like the Northwest.'

Smith will assume his duties at Oregon on June 13. He will work from his home in the Seattle area for the next two weeks because his wife, Stephanie, gave birth to their first child, daughter McKenzie, on Monday
