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Book exchange receives funding

The Incidental Fee Committee and the ASUO Executive argued for nearly two hours Wednesday night before funding a program that both sides say they fully approve of and support.

ASUO Vice President Steve Hoyt said that "the Executive is in full support of the concept" of the Student Book Exchange, a proposed nonpeal the Executive's veto.

The motion to override was defeated 3-2.

Chairwoman J. Lauren Norris argued that to overturn the veto and give the SBE \$14,226 would leave only about \$700 for the incoming IFC to work with until the end of the current fiscal year on July 1, which she said would be unfair and irresponsible.

IFC member Chad Bennion challenged Norris' assertion that the program's budget was a "black hole," arguing that the loan would be a one-time only allocation that would be paid back within a year.

The three groups eventually reached a hardfought agreement to grant the SBE a \$10,000 loan, \$3,000 of which is to be repaid on Dec. 1 of this year and the balance to be repaid by March 1.
