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Olum Administration Highlights

Paul Olum was appointed president of the University of Oregon in April of 1981. He came to the University in September of 1976 as provost and academic vice president. Before that, he was dean of the College of Natural Sciences at the University of Texas at Austin.

The son of a Russian immigrant, Olum earned his doctoral degree from Harvard in 1947, his master of arts de-

gree at Princeton in 1942, and his bachelor's degree summa cum laude from Harvard University in 1940. The following is a partial list of Paul Olum's accomplishments as president of the University of Oregon.

- Maintained and enhanced the overall quality of the university as one of the top 20 public universities in the nation in the face of funding for faculty salaries and educa-

tional program, which is the lowest among comparable institutions in the country.

- Established 20 new academic programs and research institutes. These include: neuroscience, chemical physics, materials science, macromolecular assemblies, humanities, international business, international studies, American studies, Asian and Pacific studies, linguistics, sport and human performance, historic preservation, housing research and labor education.

- Doubled financial support through research grants and contracts, which climbed from \$15.8 million in 1981-82 to \$32.0 million in 1987-88.

- Enrolled a record number of students.

- Changed from an open admissions policy to a selective admissions policy.

- Embarked upon the most significant construction program on campus in the post-World War II period. This construction program includes:

- • • building a \$45 million science complex (four new major buildings and two replacement structures)

- • • building and equipping the Earle A. Chiles Business Center

- • • constructing a new building for the UO Museum of Natural History

- • • gaining approval for a \$9 million Architecture and Allied Arts expansion and remodeling project (Construction is slated to begin this fall).

- • • laying the groundwork for the \$27 million library building expansion (Construction is slated to begin in 1990).

- • • improving athletic facilities. Included in this plan are renovation and modernization of the Hayward Field track, completion of the new sky boxes, sky suites and a press box, and construction of the Len Casanova Athletic Center.



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
