FRED FRIENDLY — A former president of CBS News.

STEPHEN J. CANNELL — A 1964 grad, he is the creator and Executive Producer of many successful TV series, including "The A-Team" and "21 Jump Street."

DONALD HODEL — A 1960 graduate of the School of Law, he served as Interior Secretary and Energy Secretary under President Ronald

Reagan.

CHARLES ROYER — Now in his third term as the Mayor of Seattle.

NEIL GOLDSCHMIDT — A 1963 graduate, Goldschmidt served as Mayor of Portland,

and Transportation Secretary under President Jimmy Carter. Since 1987 he has been the Governor of Oregon.

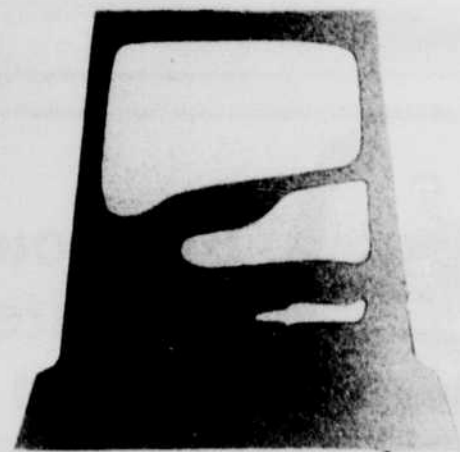
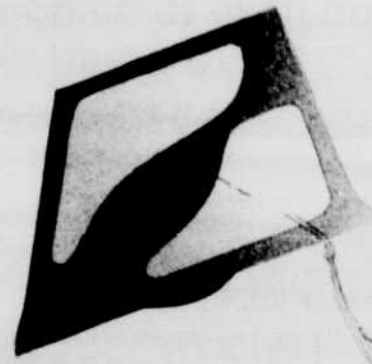
