DeSouza, the second (with Berry) of two of the Ducks' double qualifiers (in both the discus and shot put), posted the fifth-best discus throw of the day, a 182-5 toss, to qualify for Friday's finals behind Tony Washington of Syracuse, who recorded the top throw of the day at 193-5.

DeSouza finished sixth in both the discus and shot at last year's NCAA meet.

Preliminary competition continues today and the remainder of Oregon's 13 qualifiers, in 11 events, will look to advance to the finals to be

held Friday and Saturday.

Louisiana State is favored to run away with the team race, followed by Texas. Sprintstrong Texas Southern had a good day in qualifying heats with Onyali's 200-meter time and the fastest 400-meter relay time of 43.43, anchored by Onyali.
