

Police Beat

The following is a list of campus area crimes taken from Office of Public Safety and Eugene Police Department reports between June 2 and 23:

- An army surplus jacket worth \$30 was taken from a dryer in Stafford Dorm June 2.
- A purse belonging to a University student and left at a copy machine in the Knight Library was reported stolen to OPS June 2. The owner of the purse reportedly left the purse on the machine while making copies, returned to her study desk and forgot about the purse.

She returned an hour later to find the purse and its contents — \$20 cash, identification and a credit card — missing.

- A secretary in the geology department reported May 31 receiving obscene phone calls while at work during a period of one week. The calls, made by an unidentified male, consisted of heavy breathing and obscene language.

- Unknown suspects entered an unlocked room in DeBusk Dorm and stole a set of sheets, a magazine and a book bag worth a total of \$39 June 3.

- Two unidentified male suspects stole a purse from a woman who was walking on campus the night of June 5. The woman, a visiting employee of the *Los Angeles Times*, was walking in the vicinity of 13th Avenue and Agate Street when the suspects ran by on the sidewalk, stripped off the purse and ran toward some nearby dormitories.

The purse contained \$50 cash, identification and the woman's checkbook.

- A stereo and speakers were reported stolen from a room in Wilcox Dorm June 5. The owner of the stereo had been away the previous two days and said the doors to the room had been locked for all but a brief time. The stereo was valued at \$279.

- In a related incident, a leather jacket belonging to the victim's roommate worth \$130 was also reported stolen.

- A student moving out of her room in Henderson Dorm stacked some textbooks, photo albums and a Bible while preparing to move them June 9. She returned three hours later and found the items missing.

- Three couches and a bench reported stolen from a lounge in Hamilton Complex were found back in their original places June 9.

- The owner of a vehicle returned to his car to find a suspect attempting to break into the driver's side door June 9. The owner returned to the car, parked near 13th Avenue and Franklin Boulevard to find a male suspect crouched by the door. Once discovered, the suspect mounted a bicycle and rode off. The owner of the car reported that approximately \$25 worth of bicycle tools and items were inside at the time.

- An incident of criminal trespass at the Alpha Chi Omega sorority, 850 E. 15th St., was reported to EPD at 1:30 a.m. June 13. A resident at the house reported that while in the third-floor bathroom she saw a male subject in the doorway, who said he was looking for the owner of a vehicle parked outside the sorority.

The resident sent the subject downstairs, and when she went downstairs later, the subject had left. The resident reported that all of the house's doors were locked, and that it is not known how the subject entered the building.

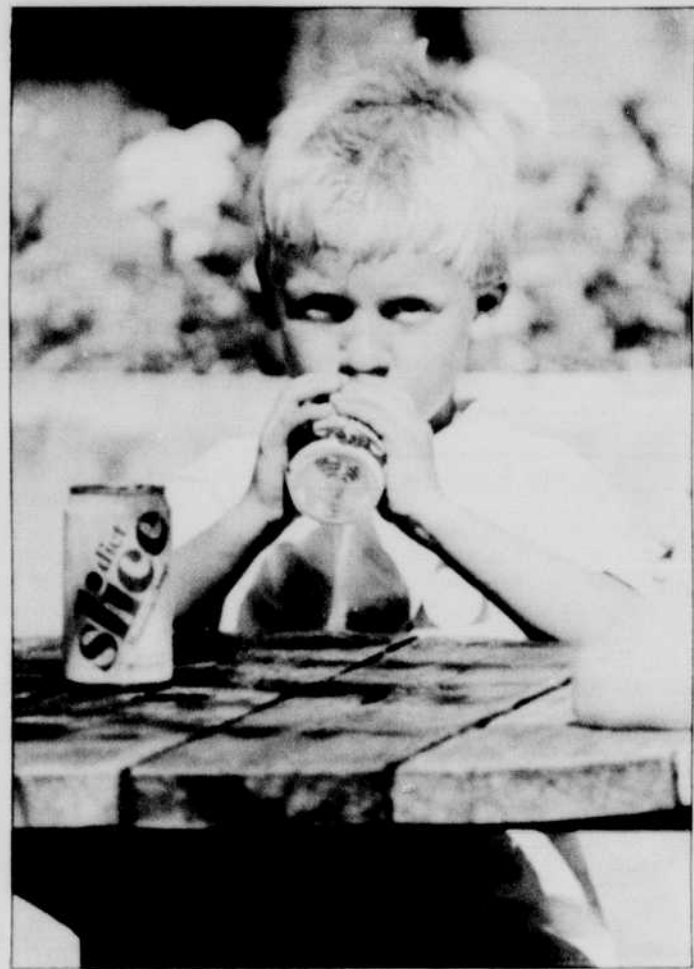
- A burglary was reported at Campus Interfaith Ministries in the Koinonia Center, 1414 Kincaid St. June 14. Stolen property included three rolls of stamps and keys for the building's interior and exterior doors.

Employees at the center reported that entry was gained by ripping off the the inside frame of a door.

- Approximately \$810 worth of jewelry was reported missing from a room in Collier Dorm June 14. The owner had reportedly forgotten the items in a jewelry box on a shelf when she had moved out of the room, and returned to recover the jewelry, only to find it gone.

- Approximately \$350 worth of compact discs were stolen from a bedroom in the Parr Tower Cooperative June 20. The owner of the discs reported that an "unlimited" number of students have access to the room.

- In addition, OPS reports eight bikes stolen, and one recovered.
