Work on 13th Avenue to end soon

The city of Eugene will complete reconstruction of the last two blocks of 13th Avenue between June 22 and mid-August.

The Wildish Corvallis Construction Co., the contractor for the project, has closed 13th Avenue to through traffic between Hilyard and Alder Streets. The city estimates the closure will last two weeks.

Because the World Veterans Championships begin in July, "We are hoping to have everything completed before the games," said Pat Bayes, engineer for the project. "A lot of participants will be staying in the area, and we are trying to be proactive toward the businesses."

If the section between Hilyard and Alder is finished within the two-week period, reconstruction will begin on 13th between Patterson and Hilyard. The city hasn't determined whether to close both lanes of 13th in that block. The decision will be made based on the amount of time it takes to finish the first section, Bayes said.

Construction hours run from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m., Monday through Friday. Some weekend work is planned.

Stores and businesses will remain open during construction, and parking will be available on side streets near 13th.

Construction crews will widen the north side of 13th Avenue, install turning pockets at the intersections of Patterson and Hilyard, replace curbs, gutters and sidewalks at intersections, relocate existing traffic signals and lay storm and sanitary sewer lines.

Reconstruction of the street began August 1, 1987, as part of the city's street preservation plan. The two-year project will cost the city \$715,000.
