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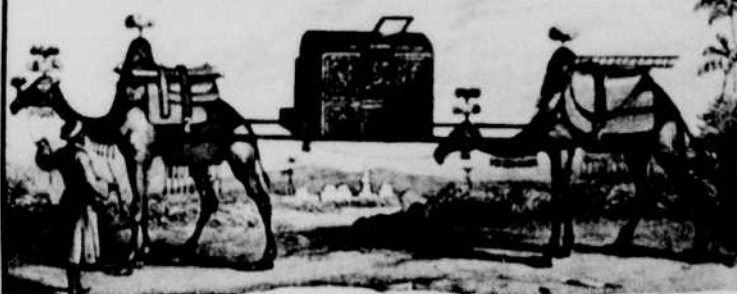

Spokane 12, Eugene 4

The Indians ambushed the Emeralds in the fourth inning with 10 runs, knocking out losing starter Matt Karchner (0-1) and reliever Ben Pardo, in a 12-4 drubbing at Spokane Thursday, June 29.

Spokane 3, Eugene 2

Brian Ahern (0-2) came out

on the losing end of a pitchers' duel in Spokane Friday, as the Emeralds dropped a 3-2 decision to the Indians.

The loss put the Ems at 2-3 for the five game series in Spokane, and squandered designated hitter David King's solo homer in the fourth inning. It was King's third homer in five games.

Eugene 3, Boise 2

The Hawks used seven pitchers in holding the Emeralds to a slim margin of victory Saturday at Civic Stadium. Em starter Chris Schaefer had built up a 2-0 lead before Boise came back to tie up the score.

Eugene's catcher, David Solseth, would set up the winning run by sending the ball to deep left for a triple to open up the eighth inning. John Gilchrist was inserted as a pinch runner, and later scored on Ron Collins' RBI single.

Ed Pierce (1-1) was credited with the win. Mike Larson (0-1) was the loser.

Eugene 8, Boise 7

Ems catcher David Solseth's RBI double in the 10th inning put Eugene over Boise 8-7 in a 4½ hour marathon contest at Civic Stadium Sunday.

The Ems led 7-6 in the ninth, but Scott Centala (2-0) couldn't hold the Hawks from knotting the score. Centala stayed to

pitch the 10th, and then earned the delayed win.

Eugene 4, Boise 2

Rightfielder John Gilchrist, batting ninth in the order, secured an Emerald win with a home run in the seventh inning at Civic Stadium Monday.

The Ems came back from a 2-1 deficit and gave Lou Talbert (2-1) the win. Ed Pierce picked up the save, his second.

Eugene 8, Boise 4

Despite a seven run third inning for Eugene, impatient fans had to wait four hours for the Ems to put the Hawks down 8-4 and touch off the Fourth of July fireworks at Civic Stadium Tuesday.

Eugene moved into a tie for first in the Southern Division of the Northwest League with Southern Oregon after improving the team record to 11-8. Rod Rogers earned his first win of the season in relief of Matt Karchner; Jorge Candelaria (2-2) took the loss.

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Heathers is dark fun

Comedy probes teenage suicide

Three people have committed suicide in the past week at your high school. Strange vibrations are circulating — are these people ultra-courageous because they had the guts to

end their lives? Is it contagious? What is causing people to end their lives so abruptly?

Such is the scenario in *Heathers*, a black comedy starring Winona Ryder and Christian Slater. Shannen Doherty, Kim Walker and Lisanne Falk star as the three Heathers.

What makes this particular movie so striking is that teenagers, not adults, are involved in the expression of their deepest, most dangerous, even murderous thoughts.

The film depicts the conflicts

facing many teenagers — that inner desire to be popular and the higher moral knowledge of right and wrong that many of us were brought up with.

Sure it's fun to be popular, but how far should we go to attain it?

Ryder is featured as Veronica, an upcoming member of the most elite clique of girls in her high school. The favorite pastime of this clique rings subtle bells of familiarity to anyone who attended high school — to be blunt and cruel to anyone less beautiful, stylish or rich.

Heathers also comes down on the media's portrayal of suicide and makes some important social statements. With comedic exaggeration, the filmmakers manage to point out some of the severe flaws of the media's and society's reactions to suicide.

Without giving away the full gist of this most fascinating flick, I will recommend it to whoever is interested in investigating a more sinister side of the high school scene. The acting is well worth your while, and the storyline will keep you enthralled.
