Bishow said. "The (west University) neighborhood is rich in historic properties, but there is a lot of pressure in the neighborhood to alter the buildings, to demolish the buildings and not preserve them."

Bishow added that the some members of the community have expressed concern over a lack of affordable housing. Some of the land zoned for housing construction is occupied by potentially protected historical sites.

One such example is a private home on 1059 Hilyard St., which Bishow said is being considered for historical status because of its age, construction and landscaping. The house is on land

that is zoned for residential use.

Shellenbarger said the city of Eugene sent letters to the owners of the potential landmarks, asking them if they were interested in having their property declared historically significant. While more than 30 of the letters so far have been positive, two of the property owners, Northwest Christian College and Sacred Heart General Hospital said they were not interested.

Bishow added that several of the houses belonging to the University's fraternities and sororities were also on the board's 1987 list, including the Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority and others.
